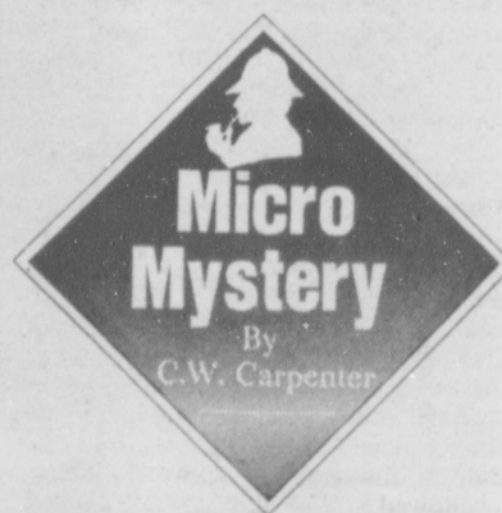


WORD POWER
