The Wights said the club's success is attributed to the Fun With Music members. "They get busy. People are congenial. They enjoy what they're doing," Gordon said.

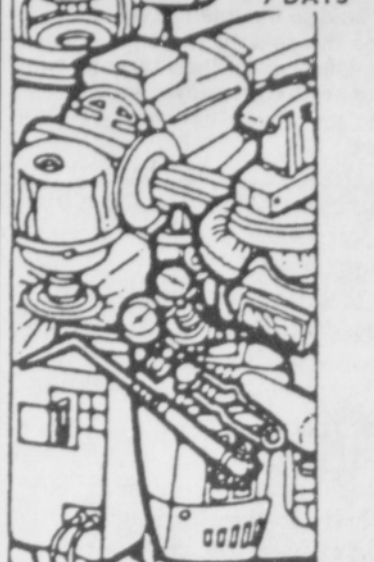

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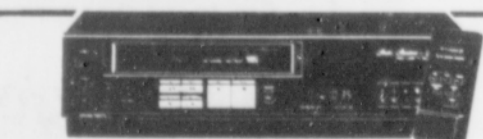
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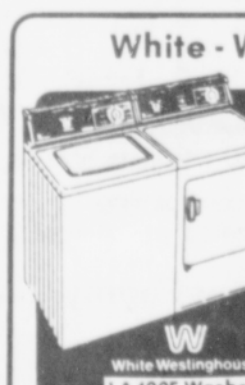
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
