After a honeymoon trip to Honolulu, the couple is at home in Beaverton.

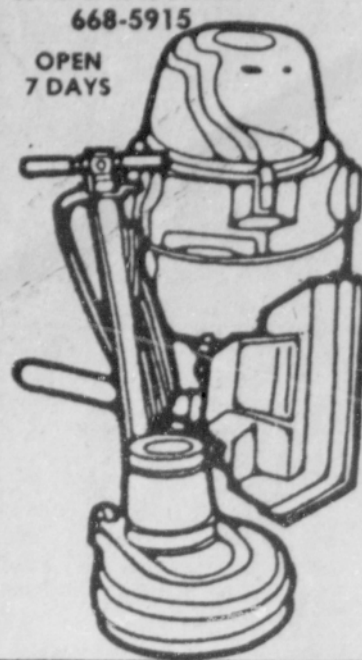
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Westering, Edwards say wedding vows

Mills completes course

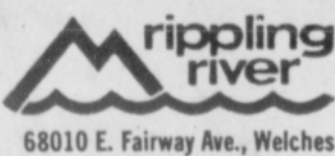
Army Private Robert J. Mills has completed an Army motor transport operator course at Fort Dix, N.J.

He is a 1984 graduate of Franklin High School in Portland.



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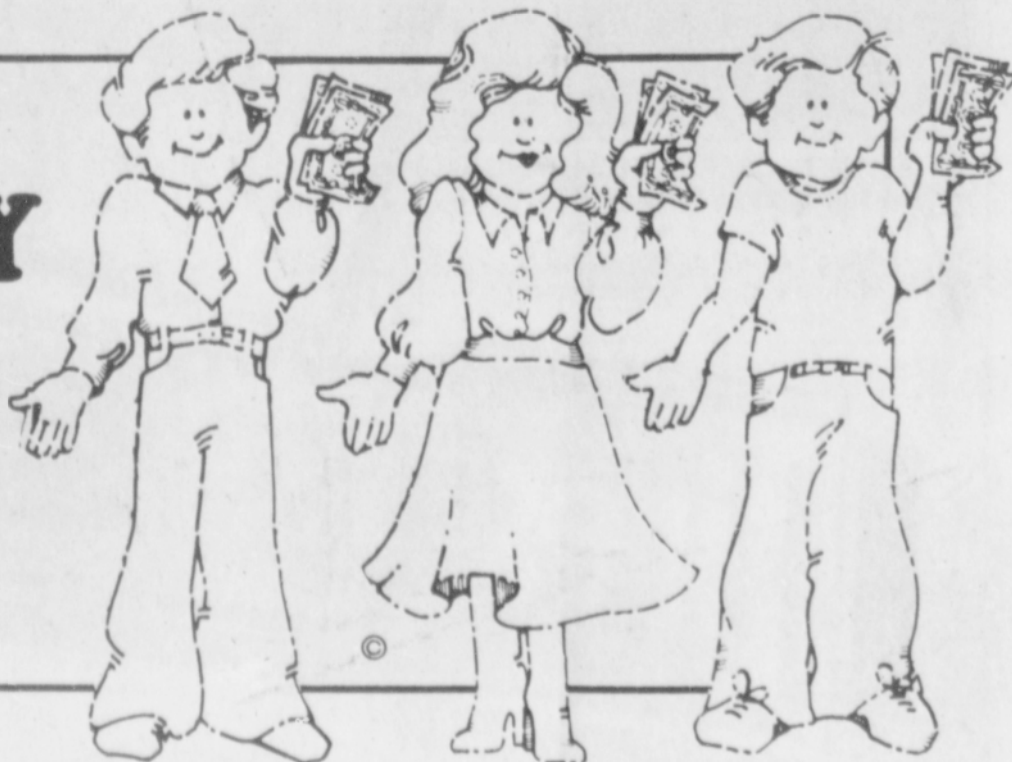
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
