

Mount Hood Medical opens trauma unit

The Mount Hood Medical Center in Gresham became the newest participant in the Multnomah County Emergency Trauma System last month.

To be on "green light" status for the trauma system, Mount Hood has to assure the immediate availability of experienced and certified emergency nurses, board-certified physicians who specialize in emergency medicine, an anesthesiologist, an operating room, a trauma surgeon, intensive care unit beds and many support services and pieces of diagnostic equipment.

The emergency trauma system started operation in March and includes major hospitals countywide that are equipped to handle serious injuries on short notice. Trauma patients, as defined in the trauma system, are those suffering various accident injuries or critical emergen-

cy illness.

"Being allowed by the county trauma system to accept these trauma victims will allow the Medical Center to better serve the community," said Joe Henery, the Medical Center's administrator. "No longer will ambulances have to spend the extra time driving to Portland when Mount Hood Medical Center can care for the patient."

The Sandy area is the third-largest source of patients for Mount Hood Medical Center. Being a part of the trauma system means Mount Hood will be able to be more responsive to Sandy-area residents, especially those who suffer severe injuries or illnesses.

Not only does Mount Hood Medical Center get many of its patients from the Sandy area, but also some of its employees.

Susan Dietderich, R.N., has lived in the Sandy area for eight years and worked in the emergency department at Mount Hood Medical Center (formerly Gresham Community Hospital) for seven and a half years.

Because she is Advanced Cardiac Life Support certified and is a certified emergency room nurse, Dietderich is a vital part of the trauma team at the Medical Center.

Dietderich received her bachelor of science in nursing from the University of Oregon school of nursing and has a diverse background including experience as a public health nurse and acting head nurse of the emergency room. She is currently the day shift charge nurse of the Mount Hood Medical Center's emergency department.

"Being a part of the trauma system means that Sandy area

residents will be closer to their families if they are trauma victims," Dietderich said. "Psychologically it's better for the patient if he is closer to his home and family while he's recovering."

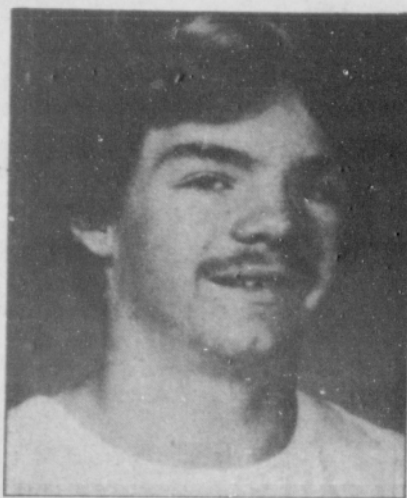
Although Mount Hood Medical Center may be considered a "small" hospital by some, it has nearly all the capabilities of its larger neighbors, and some specialties of its own. Without these capabilities, the hospital would be unable to participate in the trauma system.

"I feel Mount Hood Medical Center has an excellent acute trauma care system," Dietderich added. "I think we can handle almost any type of traumatic injury or illness as well as any hospital in the Portland area. Participating in the trauma system will definitely allow us to serve people that much better."
