

Sandy youngster attends speech camp

Jeremy Adams of Sandy recently attended a unique Oregon-based program at Meadowood Springs Speech Camp. He was selected from among 140 children referred from throughout Oregon, Idaho, California, Colorado and Nevada.

Meadowood Springs Speech Camp is a summer residential camp/clinic for children age 6 to 17 with speech and hearing difficulties.

The children attend one of two

three-week sessions. A non-profit program, it is one of only three such camp programs in the United States. At Meadowood, children receive in three weeks the equivalent of about a year's speech therapy in the schools.

Adams, the son of Rae Ann Adams, participated in a variety of activities during his three-week stay. Campers at Meadowood received two individual therapy sessions each day and two group therapy sessions daily.

Occupational services were provided daily also.

Swimming, canoeing, night hikes, campfires, arts and crafts, and cook-outs were a few of the events the campers engaged in while at Camp Meadowood. Prior to the close of each session, an awards ceremony was held to honor and recognize the outstanding achievements of campers. They were also awarded a t-shirt as a reminder of their ex-

perience at Meadowood Springs.

Meadowood also serves as an off-site training facility for several universities around the country. Students enroll through their university or through Portland State University for three to six credit hours of speech pathology and audiology. Each "trainee" is assigned a caseload of two campers and works under the direct supervision of a master clinician.

Camper tuition is \$700 for a three-week session. Adams was sponsored by the Gateway Elks Lodge, Clackamas County Educational Service District and the Kiwanis Club of Sandy.

The keynote speaker will be William Davis, former administrator of the Office for Social and Economic Development at the Baha'i World Centre in Haifa, Israel. The public is invited.

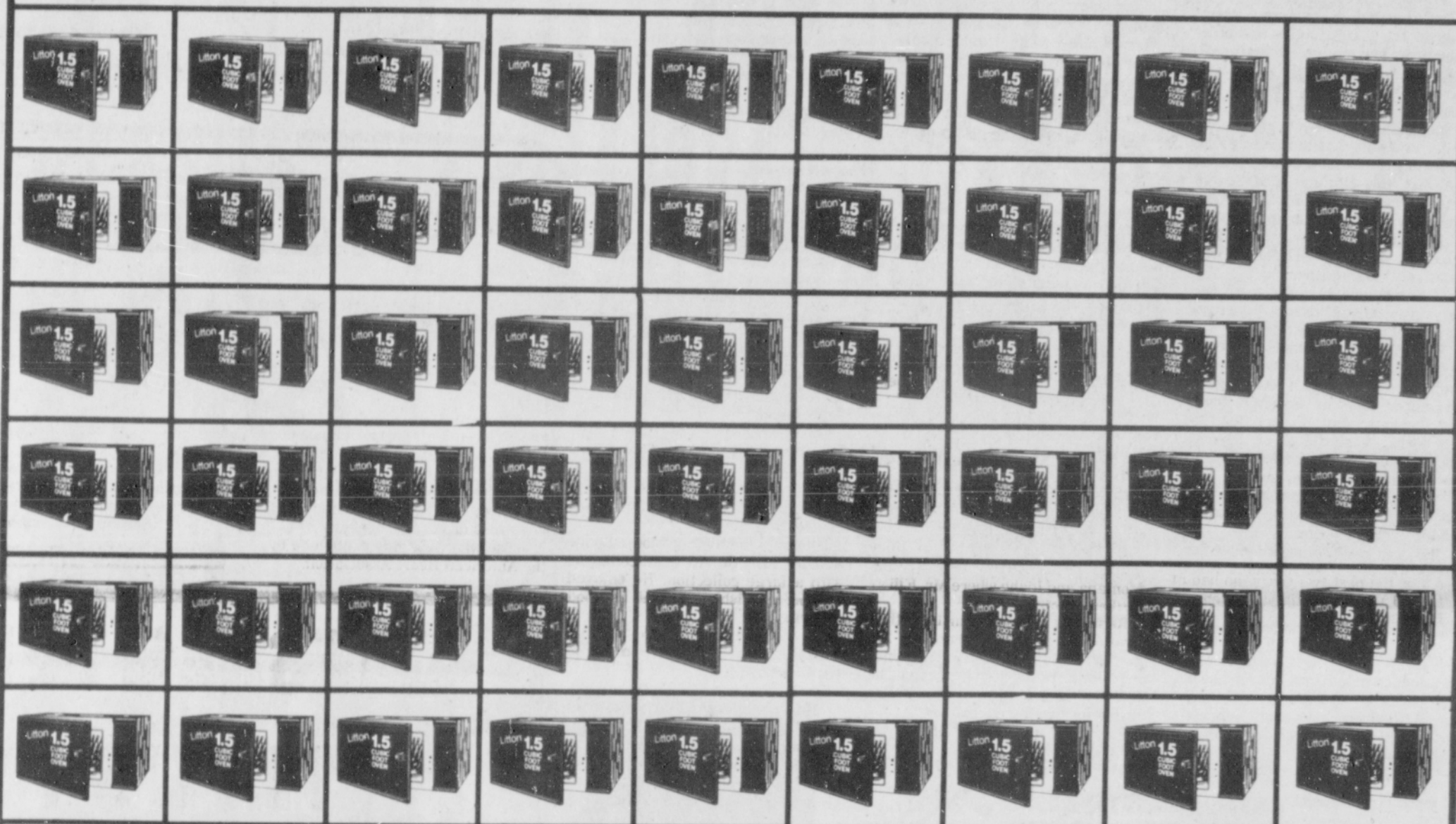
As of this year, Baha'is will forgo the celebration of World Peace Day, which they initiated in 1959, in support of International Day of Peace, proclaimed by the U.N. General Assembly in 1981. It is celebrated annually on the third Tuesday of September, the opening day of the regular assembly, and is dedicated to strengthening the ideals of peace.

Dr. Schuyler Lininger, secretary for the Sandy Baha'i community, said "The time is long overdue for nations to bind together to make a commitment toward a universal and lasting peace."

He added that the Portland program is designed to motivate individuals to eliminate all forms of prejudice and foster a high standard of justice and tolerance for all peoples.
