

Youth from Boring New York bound

"Corrupting" recipes and entering cooking contests are favorite occupations for Lynne Petricevic, a 17-year-old from Boring who is one of 28 finalists in the "Now You're Cooking" national competition sponsored by Seventeen Magazine and General Foods.

The competition is paying for Lynne's four-day trip to the Culinary Institute of America in Hyde Park, N.Y., where the finalists will compete for four \$2,000 college scholarships, one in each menu category. Thanks to hurricane Gloria, the competition was postponed to Nov. 1 through 4.

Lynne submitted a complete menu in each of the four categories; the judges picked her 30-minute meal for the cook-off.

"We made it to the playoffs and beat Corvallis in the 2 p.m. game in Portland," Lynne's story line for the menu begins. "Some of my friends live too far from town to go home and get back in time to go to the victory dance. Four of us will make the dash to my house where we will fix the meal."

The story is mythical. So is the table setting Lynne is bringing to New York to serve her meal. She is a senior at Central Catholic High School, whose colors are cardinal and gold. But she could not find any dishes in those colors, so she sewed a blue and white tablecloth with the words "Go Central Go," made blue and white pom-poms, and carved out a five-pound chocolate football to hold white carnations for her centerpiece.

In a way, Lynne's sponsoring teacher is also mythical. Central Catholic has no home economics teacher, she explained. So she got another teacher to sign the forms and excuse her from school.

Her cooking experience comes partly from years in 4-H, and partly from cooking experiments with her mother, Toby, and her brother, Stephen. Stephen Petricevic attended the Horst Mager Culinary Institute in Portland and now cooks at Timberline Lodge.

Several years ago Lynne was one of 12 finalists in the national Bake King Products contest. This year she cooked for the county and state fairs,

and was named Miss 4-H of Clackamas County.

"I do any cooking contest I can get my hands on," she said. She has also catered a wedding and a 60-guest anniversary party.

This is the second time Lynne was picked as a finalist in the "Now You're Cooking" contest. Last year, she said, "It was a big experience for me because this was the first time away from home. I live in Boring, and you go back to New York. It was a real shock."

But she said she learned from the chefs at the institute. And they learned from her when she brought a big jar of homemade jam for one of her recipes; they were amazed that anyone still did home canning, Lynne said.

This year Lynne's 30-minute meal includes straciatella or "Torn to Rags Soup," Spicy Lamb Malaysian, Fluffy Rice, Three Bean Salad, Sherry Glass Trifle, and Turkish Style Cappuccino Coffee. As always, she came up with what she calls her "corrupted" recipes by putting together two or three published recipes and changing the ingredients.

"If I don't like the ingredients," she said, "I just take them out and put in what I think would be good — you've got to have the knack for it."

For this contest, she also had to change the ingredients to include food products from the General Foods list.

The story line for Lynne's 30-minute meal ends: "After you finish the coffee you then read the grounds to see what your future holds."

Whether Lynne's future holds a scholarship from the "Now You're Cooking" contest or not, she plans to go to Oregon State University. Since her other hobby is sewing, her dream is to teach home economics at the secondary school level.
