

TASTY TREATS FOR THANKSGIVING

With the holidays just around the corner, you may be thinking of gifts to buy, packages to wrap and goodies to eat. If you're thinking about having some friends over for a party or just a visit, fix these tasty treats.

Hot Spiced Cider

You will need:
 1/2 gallon apple cider
 1 teaspoon whole cloves
 1/4 cup brown sugar
 1 cinnamon stick

Stir brown sugar, cloves and cinnamon stick into the cider. Cover the pot and bring to a boil. Turn down heat and simmer for about 20 minutes. Pour through a strainer into cups.

Cinnamon Sugar Nuts

You will need:
 1 cup sugar
 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
 1/4 cup water
 1/2 pound shelled peanuts or walnuts

Measuring cup, measuring spoons, medium-sized saucepan, ordinary table-spoon, wax paper.

Mix sugar, water and cinnamon in the saucepan and bring to a boil over medium heat. When the mixture is clear and falls in heavy drops from the spoon, add the nuts. Stir until the nuts are well coated, spoon out onto the wax

paper and allow to dry. A jar of these nuts makes a great gift, too.

Make a gift that smells terrific and can be used as a decoration. It's easy to make, but you must start now. When you are finished putting it together, it must be stored away for two or three weeks. Waiting is hard, but it is worth it.

Pomander Ball

You will need:
 Fork or toothpick, Jar of cloves, Wire hairpin, Scissors, Firm ripe fruit (apple, orange, lemon) Dish of powdered cinnamon or allspice, Cheesecloth, String, Ribbon or yarn.

With the toothpick or fork poke tiny holes in the skin of the piece of fruit. Push a clove into each hole until the entire fruit is covered. Stick the hairpin in the stem end of the fruit, then roll it in the cinnamon or allspice. Wrap the fruit in a square of cheesecloth and tie it closed at the top. Put the fruit in a cool, dark place for two to three weeks. It will turn dry and hard. Remove the cheesecloth wrapping and tie a bow on the hairpin hanger. If you want to keep your pomander ball fresh to give as a gift later, put it in a sealed plastic sandwich bag and keep it in a sealed box or container.

If you want to make your gifts extra special, make your own wrapping

paper. The two types listed below will allow you to come up with your own very special packages.

Snowflake wrapping paper

You will need:
 Shelf paper, rice paper, typing paper, Crayons, Doily.

Lay the paper over the doily on a table or other hard, flat surface. Tape the edges down so the paper won't wiggle around. With the side of the crayon, rub over the paper. Use as many colors as you like, moving the doily around under the paper until the

whole paper is covered with designs.

Dazzle wrap

You will need:
 Heavy duty aluminum foil, Glossy acrylic polymer or white school glue, Colored tissue paper, Paint brush.

Lay a sheet of foil on a table. Tear or cut tissue paper and arrange in a design on the foil. Mix the glossy acrylic polymer with a little water and brush the mixture over the design, letting it soak through. When it dries, the tissue will stick to the foil. School glue works well, too, but won't be quite as shiny.

Turkey notes

Turkey notes are a Thanksgiving custom which began in Davenport, Iowa, in the 1890s. They have been popular ever since. What are turkey notes? Here are some examples:

Turkey red, turkey blue,
 Don't end up
 In turkey stew.

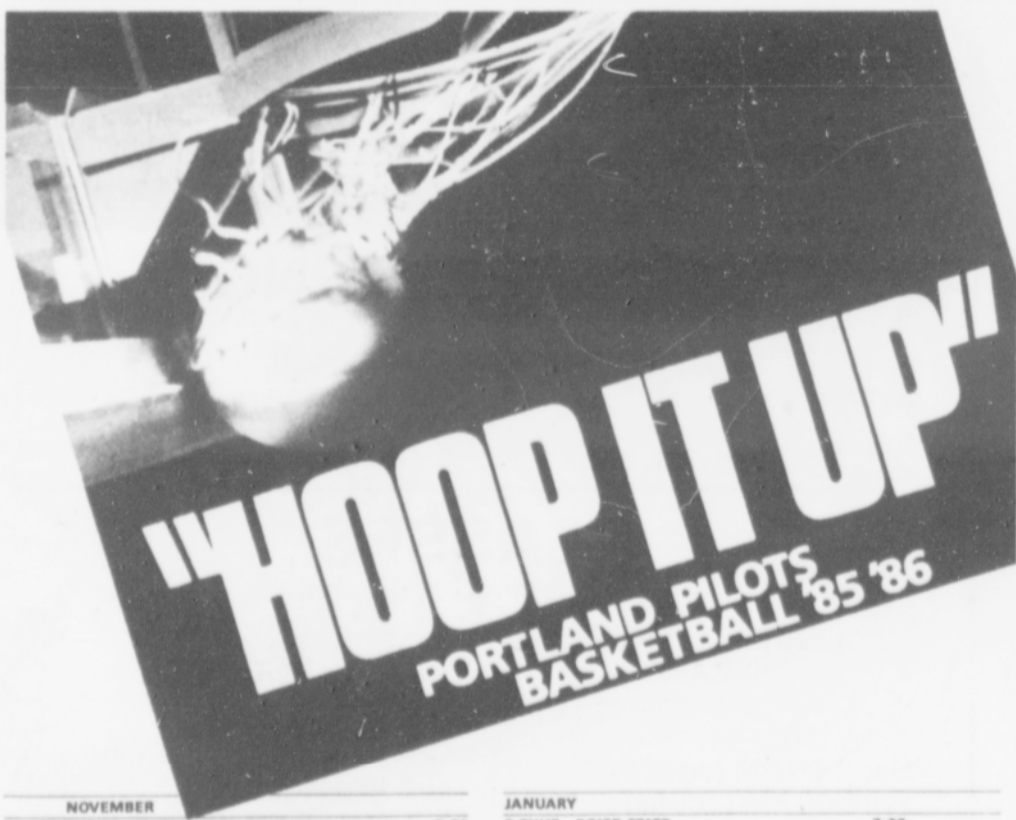
Turkey green, turkey yellow,
 Turkey says
 You're a fine fellow.

Turkey red, turkey blue,

 I love you.

To make a turkey note write a verse in the same pattern as those above. Begin with "turkey" plus a color to match with your rhyme. Copy the poem on a 3 x 5 card or paper. Then roll the card in a colorful wrapper of tissue or construction paper that's long enough to make a fringe by cutting the paper at each end. Tie each end with a ribbon, yarn or string.

Turkey notes usually are not signed so the author can say anything. Some notes are funny. Some are romantic. But most notes are written in the spirit of the season and with the thought of the coming Christmas season.
