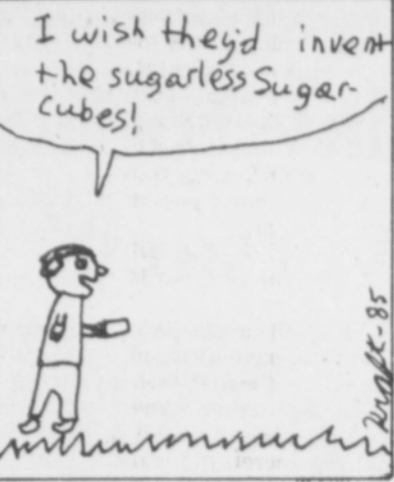
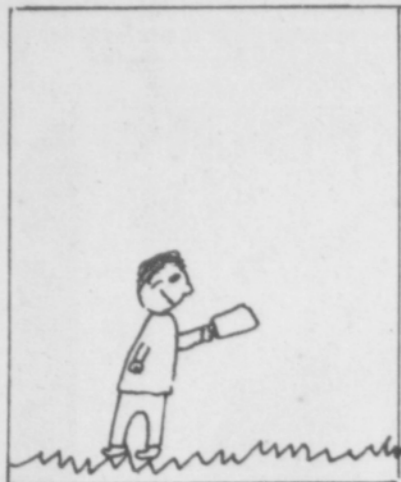
Seniors with November birthdays will be honored at the monthly birth-

Iola Kerslake

Memorial services were held Monday at Gresham Little Chapel of the Chimes for Sandy resident Iola Marian Kerslake, who died Friday at the age of 79.

Mrs. Kerslake was born May 22, 1906, in Brantford, Minn. She lived there about six years before moving to Minneapolis and Hibbing.

She came west in 1925, when she and a friend got a ride to Yellowstone Park where they worked for the summer.

According to family members, the two women disregarded the fact that they were not men and heeded Horace Greeley who advised young men to "go West." They hitchhiked toward the coast and landed in Yakima, Wash., where they worked during the apple season. They then hitchhiked to Portland where Mrs. Kerslake went to work in the Shriner's hospital in November, 1925.

She married Harold F. "Pat" Kerslake on Aug. 4, 1931, in Vancouver, Wash.

Mrs. Kerslake liked hats, fishing, streams, lakes and mountains, especially Mount St. Helens and Mount Hood. She once climbed Mount Hood.

She moved to Wemme in 1973 where she lived before moving to Sandy three years ago.

She was a member of the Amaranth Court of Sunnyside, American Association of Retired Persons, National Travelers Club of Floral Park, N.Y. and the Mount Hood Community Senior Citizens.

She was a member of the First Church of Christ, Scientist.

She is survived by her daughter, Marian J. Rueppell, Beaverton, and two grandchildren. Also surviving are brothers and sister: Charles N. and Gayle B. Urbach, Torrance, Calif.; and Jane F. Jones, Portland.

Myrtle Deming was born Myrtle Ena Newton in Maple Creek, Saskatchewan, Canada, on Nov. 25, 1907. She died at her home in Sandy on Nov. 18 at the age of 77.

After high school she continued her education in nurse's training at Devils Lake, North Dakota. While receiving her training she met Donald Deming, who she married on Dec. 14, 1930 in North Dakota.

They lived in North Dakota where they began their family. In 1936 they came to Oregon to make their home at Sandy Ridge.

She became active in the P.T.A. at Sandy Ridge School and at the Sandy Community Church. When the Sandy Community Presbyterian Church was formed in 1952, Mrs. Deming became a charter member. She served as a deaconess in the church and was active in other women's activities.

Mrs. Deming was also a member of Eastern Star. In 1982, she was elected to serve as the queen for the Sandy Mountain Festival.
