Five years later, the couple moved to California, and in 1942 they moved to Corbett. They have lived in Gresham since 1951. She worked during the summers at a cannery in Gresham.

She was a member of St. Henry Catholic Church, a member of the Catholic Alter Society since 1942, and a member of the Gresham Senior Citizens.

Stanley Gillespie

Funeral for Stanley Edmon Gillespie, a longtime Boring area farmer, was Wednesday at Bateman Funeral Chapel.

Mr. Gillespie died last Saturday in a Portland hospital at the age of 88.

He was born on Sept. 1, 1897, in Darlington, Mo., the second of 10 children born to Whit and Mary Gillespie.

As a young man he resided in many states prior to marrying Violet G. Paxton on Nov. 20, 1920, in Beatrice, Neb. The couple lived in St. Joseph, Mo., until moving to California in 1937, and to Oregon in 1938.

They purchased a farm in Boring in 1940 and raised berries, vegetables and, for a period of time, cattle. He was employed in the shipyard during World War II, and also maintained his farm. He was active in farming until three years ago when he became ill.

He was a member of Damascus Grange No. 260.

He is survived by his wife, Violet G. Gillespie of Boring; his two daughters, Marian Pillster of Boring and Rosalie Tangen of Portland; his five sons, Stanley Gillespie of Gresham; Richard Gillespie of Portland; Melvin Gillespie of Sandy; Edmon Gillespie of Woodburn; and Duane Gillespie of Priest River, Idaho.

Robert Rolli

Funeral for Robert H. (Bob) Rolli, a longtime resident of Boring, was Wednesday at Bateman Funeral Chapel.

Mr. Rolli, who was employed as a tie and timber inspector for Union Pacific Railroad since 1951, died Saturday, March 8 at a local hospital of cancer at the age of 59.

He was born in Middleton, Wis., on April 7, 1926, and was raised on his parents' dairy farm.

In December of 1943, he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corp and served in the Tank Battalion in the Pacific Division.

After his honorable discharge in

March of 1946, he returned to Wisconsin for a short while, then came to Boring to visit a friend he met in the Marine Corp. During his visit he met his future wife, and was married on July 30, 1948, at Gresham Methodist Church.

He became an active volunteer with the Boring Fire Department and attained the position of captain. He became a member of the West Coast Lumber Inspection Bureau.

In 1951 he began working for the Union Pacific Railroad as a tie and timber inspector, traveling extensively and enjoying the travel.

He was a member of the Cross Tie Association, American Wood Preservers Association, American Railway Engineering Association, Mountain View Men's Club and Gresham Elks.

His hobbies included golf, landscaping, vegetable and flower gardening, and building and repairing "almost anything" for his children and grandchildren.

He is survived by his wife, Jean I. Rolli of Boring; his daughter, Roberta Genevieve Jackson of Boring; his son Richard Wayne Rolli of Sandy; his brothers, Roger Rolli of Oregon City; Ervin Rolli of Panama; Victor Rolli of Garden City, Kan.; Richard Rolli of Madison, Wis.; and James Rolli of Marshall, Wis.; his sisters, Dora Hoffman of Oregon, Wis.; and Janet Stevens of Madison, Wis.; and his mother, Louise Rolli of Madison, Wis.
