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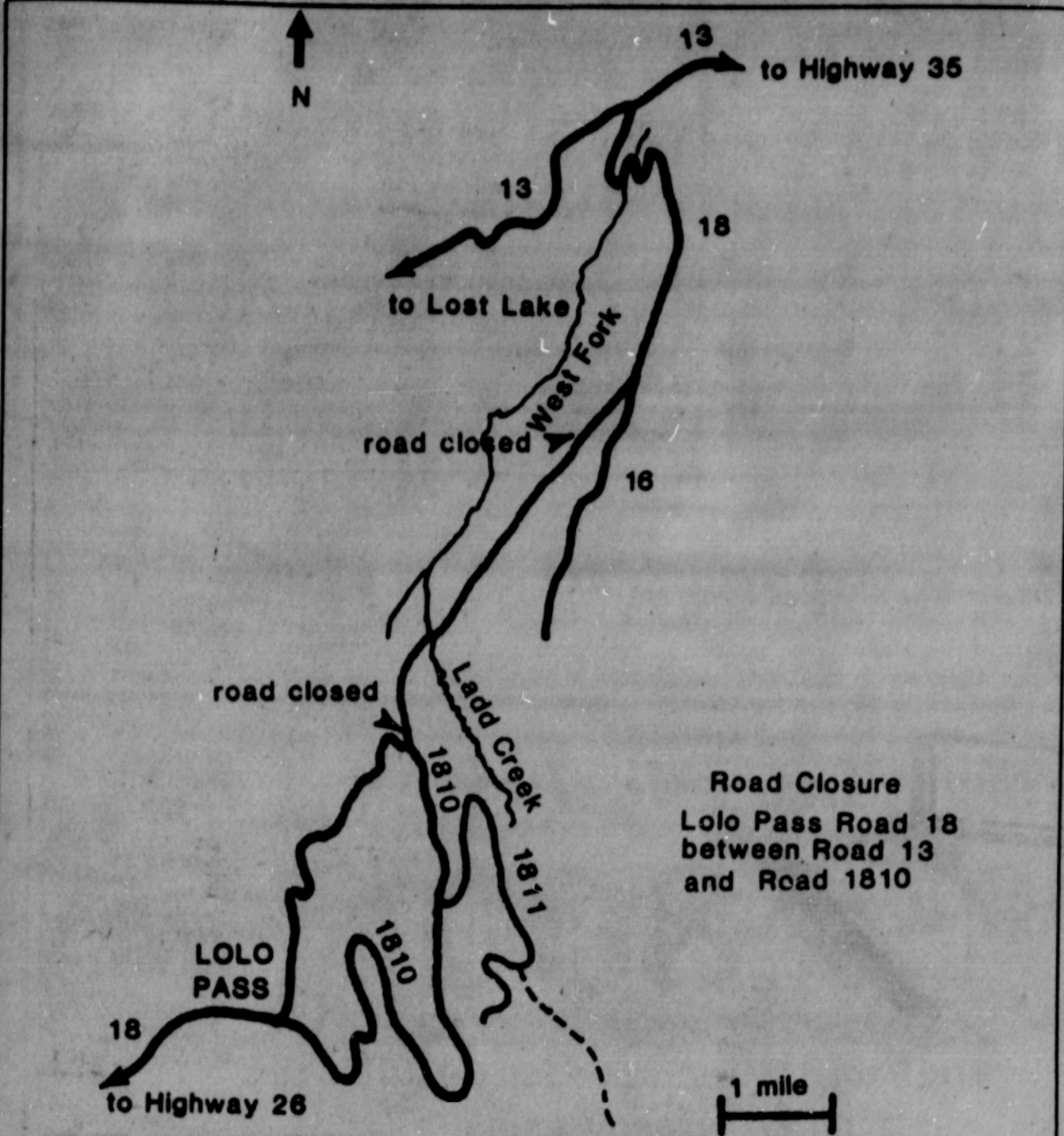
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Lolo Pass Road closes

The Hood River side of Lolo Pass Road 18 will be closed for bridge replacement beginning Aug. 11. It will remain closed for about two months, according to Charlie Parker, Hood River District

ranger for the Mount Hood National Forest.

The road will be physically blocked at the junction of Roads 18 and 16, and at the junction of Roads 18 and 1810. Access to Cathedral

Ridge Trail no. 625 is still possible from the west.

The closure will permit replacement of the bridge across Ladd Creek.

Sandy Union High School District UH2 calls for bids for asphalt repaving of the parking lot of the high school building. The existing asphaltic concrete paving has been in place for thirteen years and is broken in places to a depth of six to eight inches. All bidders must present bids based on the following criteria:

a. The repaving work will consist of a parking lot containing approximately 67,000 square feet of asphaltic concrete. New paving work will consist of a sidewalk approximately 100 feet by ten feet.

b. The repaving work shall include excavating and filling all broken areas of the parking lot and overcoating with asphaltic concrete to a depth not less than one and one half inches.

c. The parking lot shall be striped and numbered according to school district layout.
