50-meter obstacle course; firing the Greek military's .45-caliber pistol, .45-caliber Thompson submachine gun and 7.62mm assault rifle; orienteering, which demands both stamina and map reading skills over a set course; and grenade throwing. Each nation fields six three-man teams in the competition, which is broken down in divisions of novice, veteran and over-35.

"We have a good team this year with many new competitors," said Harding, a plant nursery owner who lives in Tualatin with his wife, Bonnie, and 8-year-old son, Brady. "The rookies are a weakness with their inexperience, but they have enthusiasm."

"The dry climate and the heat will affect the competition this year, but I think we should do pretty good," Harding said prior to the Athens competition.

CIOR's annual pentathlons are held in a different NATO nation each year, though not all NATO nations belong to CIOR because they do not have reserve forces. Last year, the CIOR competition was in Oslo, Norway. In 1987, the pentathlon is scheduled for Copenhagen, Denmark. Other CIOR nations include

France, Canada, Belgium, West Germany, the United Kingdom and Holland.

"I had some experience with the Greeks during our competition in Athens in 1975 and I remember many pleasant experiences," said Harding.

"The best thing about the CIOR competitions is seeing my friends — U.S. and foreign."

"Our team is also a diplomatic excursion, where we can hopefully create a positive image of U.S. servicemen."

of losing the close games."

The reason? Funderberg says it is experience. With 18 starters back from last year, he is confident a winning season is in the making.

"The 25 seniors have a great impact in terms of leadership, knowledge and experience," Funderberg said. "For our first practice, we looked pretty sharp."

Offensively, Sandy's returning starters include: Ben Glawe, left tackle; Paul Weise, center; Bob Daugherty, right guard; Mo Emerich, right tackle; Steve Pearson, split end; Tony Hale, tight end; Byron Stamm, tailback; Dean

Weaver, flanker; and Rob Spanier, quarterback.

Defensively, returning starters include: Gerald Hale, free safety; Mark Shank, left tackle; Bill Christman, nose guard; and Dean Harris, tackle.

Funderberg added that three seniors are battling for the fullback spot.

Sandy's offensive line will be an important ingredient to a successful season. In the past, Mount Hood Conference powerhouses such as Gresham and Barlow shut down Sandy's running game. This season, Funderberg expects the running

game to be a complement to the passing game.

"We'll run a lot of veer and option," said Funderberg of Sandy's offensive sets. "We'll run out of the I (formation) and run a lot of misdirection plays. Our offensive line has gotten handled in the past. We're going to have more confidence in the run this year which will open up our passing game. We'll throw the ball a lot — probably 30 times a game."

"We're not going to throw any more than we have. We're going to throw more effectively."

Receivers that Spanier will be looking for are Stacey Pearson, Tony

Hale, Gerald Hale, Dan Weaver and Randy Wheeler.

"We like to be pretty diversified," said Funderberg. "We're not afraid to pass on first down and we may run on third and long, too."

Sandy is faced with a tough schedule the first half of the season. Its first opponent is David Douglas on Friday, Sept. 5, with a non-counter against Milwaukie and an away game at Gresham to follow.

"Right now we are focusing on David Douglas," said Funderberg. "If we win two of those first games we'll be all right."
