The townspeople of Sandy have again given generously to the 79th annual fund drive across North America to provide relief for the underprivileged, according to information from the Sandy Seventh-day Adventist Church.

Medical and educational centers also benefited. Over \$1,200 was donated statewide during this year's appeal.

About 13 percent of this money returns to Sandy. Last year the Dor-

cas Society, a community service organization of the Adventist Church, gave out hundreds of pieces of bedding, clothing and foodstuffs.

Worldwide, through all Adventist ministries, 2,540,614 people received 9,058,667 articles of clothing. Cash and food values exceeded \$6.5 million. Volunteers worldwide donated 2.7 million hours in combined relief efforts.

Workshop set on immigration

Details on how employers can prepare for the affects of the new immigration law will be provided in a two-hour workshop Jan. 23 at J. Frank Schmidt and Son Nursery in Boring.

Beginning at 7 p.m., questions on numbers of workers, farm labor contracting services and identification requirements will be answered by Ken Bailey, chairman of the Oregon

Farm Bureau Federation's Labor Advisory Committee, and Don Schellenberg, manager of the OFBF's Governmental Affairs Division.

A video-taped interview with attorney Monte Lake of Washington, D.C., will be presented. Lake was involved in the drafting of the immigration bill and served as the primary representative on the im-

migration reform issue for the Farm Labor Alliance, which is a coalition of Western agricultural organizations instrumental in making the agricultural guest worker program a part of the immigration bill.

The workshop, from 7 to 9 p.m., will be held in the Red Sunset Room of the nursery at 9500 S.E. 327th Ave., Boring.
