Andrew Naylor

Funeral services for Andrew J. Naylor were held Jan. 12 in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Vault interment followed at Willamette National Cemetery in Portland.

Andrew Joseph Naylor was born in Willard, Utah, to Walter and Isabelle Naylor Stevenson Jr. on Jan. 21, 1899.

He was married to Caroline Rita Tognascoli in Lewistown, Mont., on July 5, 1922. They had a son, Andrew G. Naylor.

In 1928, Mr. Naylor went to Tulalake, Calif., where he farmed and was self-employed in the trucking business.

He enlisted in 1942, serving in the U.S. Army until 1945.

After his discharge, he returned to California where he won a homestead in 1947. He later sold out and purchased a farm in MacDoel, Calif., where he resided until later moving to Boring to make his home with his son.

He died in Gresham on Jan. 8 at the age of 86 years.

Surviving is his son, Andrew G. Naylor of Boring; 6 grandchildren, seven great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandson; and a half sister, Rose Perry in Mesa, Ariz.

Lindon Lex

Lindon Lex was born in Spring Valley, Minn., on Feb. 25, 1910. He died in Gresham on Jan. 7, 1987 at the age of 76.

When he was 3, his family moved to Oregon. He was raised in the Sandy-

Kelso area. After receiving his schooling at Kelso School, he worked at several occupations until entering the U.S. Army to serve in the 41st Division during World War II.

Receiving his discharge from the service in 1942, he lived at Brightwood where he began working for Koch Logging Company.

On May 6, 1949 he was married to Agnes Lucke in Vancouver. They made their permanent home at Brightwood.

He is survived by his wife, Agnes; son, Gus Lex of Brightwood; stepsons: Ace Lucke of Portland and Allen Lucke of Sacramento, Calif.; and a brother, Lyle Lex of Kelso, Wash.

PUBLIC MEETING NOTICE CLACKAMAS COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH PLAN FOR 1987-89

Clackamas County is preparing its comprehensive plan for local mental health services for the next biennium (1987-89) and establishing priorities for addressing unmet needs for services. Public input into the plan of operation for FY 88 and the long range priorities will be coordinated by the Clackamas County Mental Health Council. Service providers, advocates, and others who would like to participate in the planning process may attend program area subcommittee meetings scheduled as follows:

JANUARY 27, 1987
1. Mental and emotional disturbances (MED)
2. Alcohol and drug problems (A&D)
3. Children, adolescents and elderly
4. Developmental Disabilities (MR/DD)

The State and the counties have agreed that subcontracted services shall be opened for competitive bidding at least once every four years. The County will review whether to continue to subcontract or to operate directly some or all of the residential services, including the Semi-independent Living Program (Fairweather Lodge). The MED Subcommittee meeting will provide an opportunity for public input on these issues. Interested persons may attend that subcommittee meeting to make their opinions known.

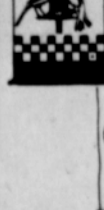

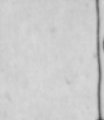
