Chamber board introduced 1987 directors outline their goals and expectations

Members of the 1987 Sandy Area Chamber of Commerce board of directors were introduced at a recent meeting and given an opportunity to tell members about themselves.

The new chamber officers are Diane Tiller, president; Fred Perrin, vice president; and Kimberly Nelson, treasurer. Board members are Joyce Williams, Phyllis Rader, George Hyland, Arnie Becker, Mike Czajka, Milt Fields and Morton Spence, past president. Sandy Secretarial Service provides secretarial support.

Diane Tiller

Tiller and her husband, Pat, own The Flower Garden, a full-service florist and small garden center. She has lived in Sandy since 1979 and opened her business in 1982.

"If you live here, you ought to be a part of what is going on," Tiller said.

Fred Perrin

Perrin and his wife have owned the Sandy Coast to Coast franchise for about 2½ years. They have lived in Estacada for 17 years, but have property on Marmot Road and would like to build a home here.

Perrin said he would like to help encourage businesses to come to Sandy and aid in the development of a close-knit community.

Kimberly Nelson

Nelson, advertising representative for the Sandy Post, attended local schools and calls Sandy her hometown.

"My aunt says I'm one of the people who didn't make it out, but I'm glad to be here," she said.

Nelson is president of the Sandy Business and Professional Women's organization, and is a member of the board of the Clackamas County Associated Chambers of Commerce.

"I believe once you volunteer, you're hooked on the fun, like working at the Wine Fair and Feast."

As treasurer, Nelson said she would recommend that the Sandy chamber institute a pay-as-you-go policy. For example, people who want to be in the chamber's business directory would have to pay in advance of the publication of the directory, she said. That would relieve the chamber of having to deal with the problem of bad debts, she said.

Joyce Williams

Williams is in her third year as a member of the board. At first she said she was tentative about joining the board, but she hasn't regretted it. "I have to say it has been a very rewarding experience working with a wonderful group of people."

Williams grew up in England and worked in banking before coming to the United States at the age of 20. She had hoped to travel some but was working within three days upon her arrival in Portland.

She is a consumer service specialist with the U.S. National Bank in Sandy, which involves performing a variety of jobs. "I love it," she said, "because I get to help people, work with them."

Phyllis Rader

Rader has been the owner of Accent Hair in Sandy for 25 years, and has lived most of her life in Sandy.

She has traveled and lived in other places, though, and knows where she wants to be. "Like someone else said, 'We've got the best spot in the world right here.'"

Among her goals is to encourage people to shop in Sandy, and to increase the chamber's membership.

George Hyland

Hyland, a chiropractor, has owned

Sandy Chiropractic Center in Sandy for 3½ years.

He graduated in 1980 from Western States Chiropractic College, and worked in Vancouver, Wash., before coming to Sandy. Before studying chiropractic medicine, he received a degree in business administration from Arizona State University and was in the Marine Corps.

Hyland has been involved in downtown beautification projects for three years. The Christmas decorations, planter boxes and other work have improved the community aesthetically, he believes.

"I'd like to see downtown improve to the extent that people would stop instead of driving on through," he said.

Arnie Becker

Becker has been involved in a number of projects in three years on the chamber board of directors, and he praised the chamber for its "successful, excellent projects."

The chamber membership provides a "terrific amount" of resources for the community to draw upon, he said.

Becker has been postmaster in Sandy since 1981, and has worked for the U.S. Postal Service for 26 years.

Mike Czajka

Czajka was a bank liquidator with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. before taking a job 2½ years ago at the Clackamas County Bank, where he is senior commercial loan officer. "I'm really a jack of all trades," he said.

"I can honestly say this has been the best job in my career," said Czajka, who has worked for 10 years in the financial industry.

Czajka said he would like to get out more and talk to business people about their needs in Sandy.

Milt Fields

Fields is an optician and has owned Wyeast Optics for about 18 months. He fits and fabricates eye-wear.

He told The Post he believes in the work chambers of commerce do and hopes to become more involved in Sandy's chamber. At present the commitments of running a new business occupy a good deal of his time.

Mort Spence

Spence is past president of the chamber, and thus will serve a year on the board ex officio.

Spence is retired from business as owner of a monthly news magazine.

"Being retired doesn't necessarily mean you sit in a rocking chair and rock away the rest of your life," he said.

He is teaching writing classes for Mount Hood Community College and Clackamas Community College, and was recently elected to the Sandy City Council.

"Prior to that, the City Council swore at me. Now I've been sworn in."

Despite his "semiretirement," Spence said he is interested in the problems of the business community and hopes to represent business as a city councilor.

Sandy Secretarial Service

Sandy Secretarial, owned by Carol Scott and Vicki Turra for nine years, has been handling chamber business for four years. It is located at 39261 Proctor Blvd.

Scott said the service is a clearinghouse of information, sending out packets to school children, business people and tourists.

"We see a lot of people, visitors from all over the country and the world. It's an exciting place to be in the summer," Scott said.
