## Sandy resident loses suit against city of Troutdale

Jurors have ruled against a Sandy resident who claimed unreasonable action on the part of a Troutdale policeman during a parking lot incident in 1984.

Multnomah County Circuit Court jurors ruled against Joseph Irvin on Friday in the courtroom of Circuit Judge James R. Ellis in Portland.

Irvin suffered an injury to the thumb on his right hand on May 19, 1984, when he was engaged in a scuf-

fle with two other men. Irvin said in the trial that Troutdale patrolman David Oliver approached him from behind and grabbed his thumb, causing a longitudinal fracture.

In the trial, Irvin asked for \$50,000 in general damages from the city of Troutdale for pain and suffering and permanent loss of strength and mobility to his thumb. Irvin also sought lost wages in the amount of \$7,492 and \$25,000 in punitive damages.

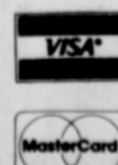
