Soccer league seeks coaches

The Sandy Cascade Soccer League, a non-profit, non-competitive athletic organization, is looking for coaches for its 1987 season.

According to SCSL board member Al Klascius, the organization is expecting an enrollment of over 400 players, aged 5 to 14. However, the SCSL board is searching now for 30 to 40 coaches, through whom the players may register.

"It would be nice to have a few ex-

tras," Klascius said of the number of coaches the league needs. He added that the league is looking for coaches other than the players' parents. Anybody with coaching or playing experience in soccer is urged to take on a coaching challenge.

When registration for players begins, the fee of \$25 will be used for maintenance and insurance for the league. However, Klascius said that

the fee is less expensive than Gresham league fees.

The purpose of the league is not competition, but instead the enjoyment and the education of the sport of soccer.

Saints grab close victory

Terrence Ransom made a free throw with no time left to give the Mt. Hood Community College men's basketball team an exciting 72-71 win over Southwestern Oregon Community College Saturday night in Coos Bay.

The win evened the Saints' overall record at 9-9.

Ransom's winning free throw came after SWOCC had tied the game at 71 with only 10 seconds remaining. The Saints then rushed the ball upcourt with guard Sean Mitchell driving to the left side.

"Ransom was all alone under the basket," said MHCC coach Andy McClouskey. "Mitchell goes up, fakes and passes to Ransom. They (SWOCC) creamed him as time expired."

That sent Ransom to the line for two free throws. He missed the first one, but the second one went in to

give the Saints the win over the Lakers.

"I didn't watch it," said McClouskey about the winning free throw. "I watched him (Ransom). I knew when he started jumping up and down that he made it."

The Saints made only 6 of 13 free throws in the game and the poor foul-shooting continues to concern McClouskey. But MHCC shot 65 percent (31 of 48) from the field and committed only eight turnovers, compared to 19 for SWOCC.

"It was a helluva finish," said McClouskey. "The guys really hung in there."

The game was tied at 31 at halftime and remained tight throughout the second half, although the Saints had to battle from behind.

SWOCC was up 60-53 with about seven minutes remaining in the game when Mike Evans nailed two

straight three-point shots to bring the Saints within three points, 62-59.

A basket at the 3:20 mark by Anthony Roberts tied the game for MHCC at 62. Two minutes later, Roberts made a layup and Matt Sand scored a bucket to put the Saints ahead 70-66.

But Terry Thomas, who tallied 22 points, scored five points for SWOCC down the stretch, including the basket that tied the game at 71.

It was a much-needed and surprise win for the Saints as SWOCC entered the game with a 12-2 overall record and had to be the favorite to win on its home court, especially after MHCC lost 80-72 to lowly Umpqua Friday.

"It's a funny situation with our team," said McClouskey. "It's nice to be giant killers, but we haven't beaten the teams we're supposed to beat."

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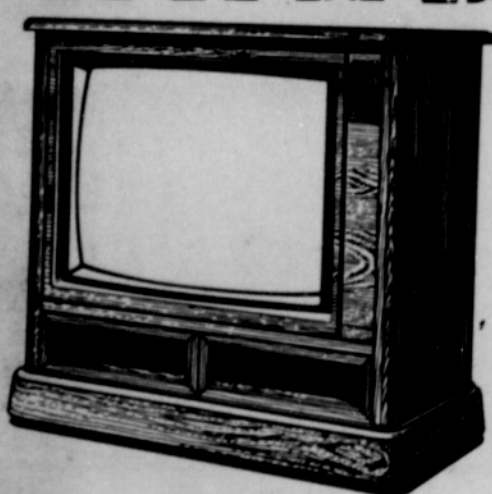
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
