Plans are under way for the summer musical, "Annie." "Annie" will be presented instead of "Little Mary Sunshine," as previously announced.



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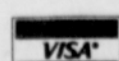
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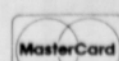
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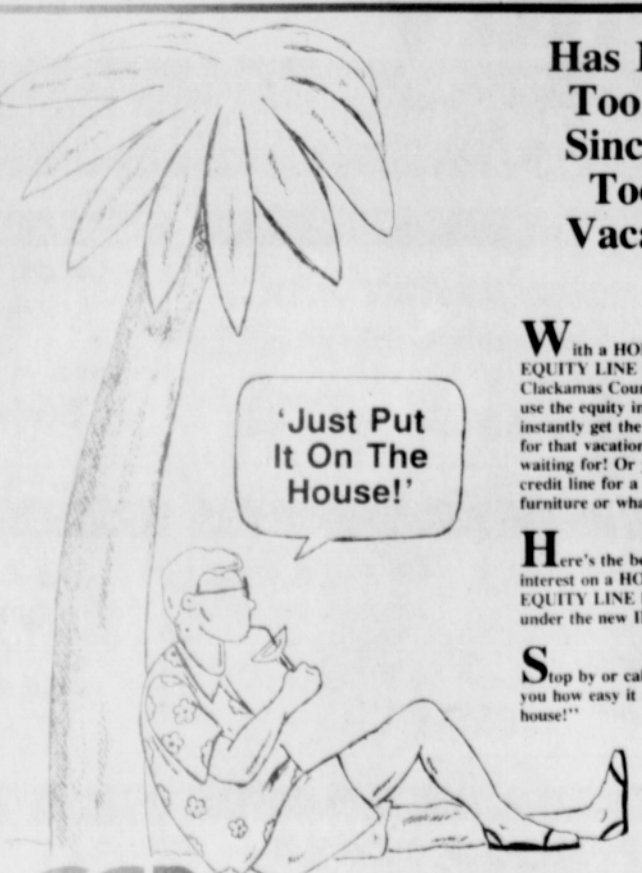
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
