The couple farmed in the Cherokee area until 1942, when they moved to Gresham. He worked as a welder in the shipyard during World War II.

He was a member of St. Henry Catholic Church and a member of the Knights of Columbus. He enjoyed hunting and fishing and being outdoors.

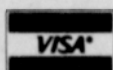
