Agent offers winter tips

Yellow grass needs nitrogen

Landscape plants and lawns usually get by on their own pretty well during the winter months.

But yellow-looking turf grass and shrubs located close to house foundations may need help during the cold season.

"The yellowing of turf grass indicates that the lawn needs nitrogen," says Ray McNeilan, Oregon State University Extension home gardening agent.

To put the green back in yellow grass, apply a slow-release nitrogen

fertilizer to the turf at the application rate recommended on the fertilizer package.

"A slow-release fertilizer is best for winter use because of heavy winter rains," McNeilan says.

"Rain leaches nutrients out of fertilized soils," he says. "The heavier the rain, the more leaching occurs."

"Slow-release fertilizers slow the leaching process."

Even though winter rains may be heavy in Oregon, gardeners should not count on the rain to provide ade-

quate water to all landscape plants, McNeilan says.

Many plants grow in areas pro-

ected from the rains.

Plants underneath the wide eaves on many Oregon houses, for instance, are likely to be quite dry.

"Rain water doesn't spread laterally, so you may need to get out the garden hose and give plants some water," McNeilan says.

And during periods of cold weather, a well-watered plant has greater protection against freezing than a dry one.

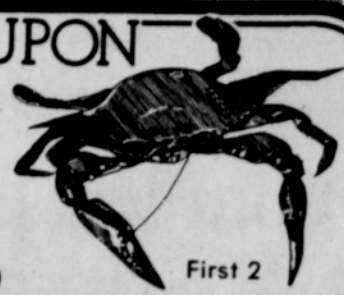
