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taking action this spring. An election for funding has been considered for May.

Plan "A" calls for an extensive remodeling of the Thriftway building and a remodeling of the current City Hall. The Thriftway building would contain a 6,000-square-foot library, a senior center and expanded council chambers and meeting areas. The total cost would be \$1.7 million. The city has about \$700,000 available for the project through grants and other sources. Taxpayers could expect to pay \$1.16 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation over a 10-year period.

Plan "B" This alternative calls for a doubling in size of the current City Hall, which was built in 1969. It does not

address some of the problems that come with having the Sandy Senior Center in a separate facility. In addition, there is a lack of parking at the senior center, and having two levels is considered a disadvantage in a senior center.

The remodeling would solve problems caused by a shortage of space in the library and Police Department.

Taxpayers could expect to pay about 34 cents per \$1,000 of valuation over a 10-year period.

Plan "C" This one has not been discussed in great detail. It calls for the building of a new library on a separate piece of property at a cost of \$445,000. Cost of the property has not been included

in the price.

Plan "D" This one is similar to plan "A," except that \$273,000 would not be spent to renovate the current City Hall. The cost to renovate the Thriftway building is estimated at \$927,000.

Some citizens said they liked the idea of having all of the city's departments located within two buildings across from each other downtown.

Phil Jonsrud pointed out that the parking lot at the Thriftway building might prove to be a valuable asset. Phyllis Rader said some people believe the Sandy Post Office made a mistake by moving away from the downtown area, a mistake she does not think the city should make.

Plan "D" might also be more palatable to voters. The savings in remodeling would reduce the cost to

about 85 cents per \$1,000 valuation over a 10-year period.

Other plans

The city could purchase a piece of property off Langensand Road, on the east end of Sandy, for considerably less than it could purchase the Thriftway building, Reber said. The property does not front Highway 26. On a per-square-foot basis, the cost of building a new building does not differ much from what it would cost to remodel the Thriftway.

Another piece of property being considered is the Stone's property on Pioneer Boulevard, between Decker and Scales clothing store and Benjamin Franklin Savings and Loan.

These other plans are still in the exploratory stages, Reber said. Reber has said the City Council is not "married to any of these plans."

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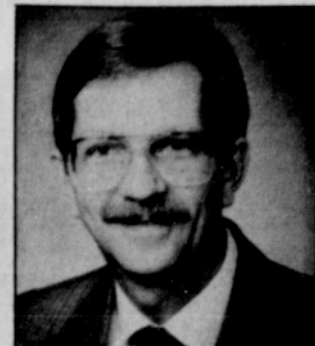
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
