A funeral was held Feb. 20 at Bateman Funeral Chapel. He was buried in Forest Lawn Cemetery.

Gretchen A. Metzger, a resident of Boring, died at her home on Feb. 25 at the age of 65.

She was born Sept. 18, 1921, in Ringgold County, Iowa. She moved with her parents to East Multnomah County in 1932, where she attended Fairview Grade School. After graduating from Gresham High School in 1939, she attended business college and was employed as a secretary for two years at Alcoa Aluminum Company of America (now Reynolds Metals).

Mrs. Gaulke died at Mount Hood Medical Center in Gresham on Feb. 28 at the age of 79.

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not always end up in the same stream or even the same drainage basin.

The Sandy High School students will carry the fish in buckets to different parts of the stream for release. It will not be the first time their elbow grease has been used by the Forest Service.

Students last year landscaped a steep bank that was created by the construction of Highway 26 years ago. The students did a "beautiful job" of stabilizing the slope, Uebel said.

The environmental science class studies a number of topics, and Hutchinson said it has "experts" in many areas of wildlife. Douglas is the class expert on fish runs, Hutchinson said.

"It's hard for people to comprehend that a 16-year-old can be that knowledgeable," Hutchinson said. "If you had 20 people in every community that knowledgeable, you could close hatcheries. Those resources could be allocated to other areas of habitat development."
