Nine students from Sandy are planning to go on the exchange with Sandy High School's new sister school, which is in Peine, near Hanover.

Items to be auctioned off include water skies, cords of wood, clothing, gift certificates to Sandy stores, yard work, baby-sitting and other items

Sandy and the school in Germany are expected to take turns hosting exchange students. Ruth Sherman, English and German language teacher, said she is "very impressed" with the exchange pro-

gram they are participating in.

according to Frasier, it had been kept in a safe at Sandy High School.

Roberts told the board that the document would be stored in a specially designed case that would protect it from dust, moisture and changes in temperature.

Dave Enna of Zig Zag, grandnephew of Emil Enna, lightheartedly told the board that his family was going to stay neutral on the issue.

Board member Bob Boring then proposed that the score be given to

the Oregon Historical Properties Commission with the stipulation that it be loaned temporarily to the Sandy Pioneer and Historical Association when that group opens a museum. He also stipulated that the score be loaned to other cities with a claim to some degree of ownership.

The board approved Boring's motion unanimously.

J.A. Buchanan, who wrote the lyrics, lived in Yamhill and Astoria, so those communities may be given

the opportunity to display it. The Sandy Pioneer and Historic Association and Sandy High School will receive copies of the score.

Buchanan's grandson, Roger, said in an interview with The Post that his grandmother, J.A.'s first wife, may have composed the music for the song. She was a concert pianist.

"Grandmother told me she had played a joke on history, that she would never get credit (for writing the state song)," Buchanan said.

Henry Murtagh is credited, on the musical score and in newspaper clippings of the time, with being the composer. Roger Buchanan said he had a difficult time turning up any information on Murtagh.

Herman Jobelmann, president of the Musicians Union Local 99 in Portland and a friend of Emil Enna's, said that when he was young he saw Murtagh, an organist, play several times.

Jobelmann said the Oregon state song was well known until about 25 years ago, when groups stopped playing it at community functions.

budget are attributed to:

- The purchase of a mainframe computer to replace two smaller computers. The volume of use by many agencies — including municipal police departments — makes this replacement necessary, Detloff said.

- The sheriff's office designation as the emergency operations center. A small amount of the levy would be used to purchase needed materials, Detloff said.

For example, during a flood in Hoodland two years ago, the county dumped sand to help keep roads open. The sheriff's office footed the

bill.

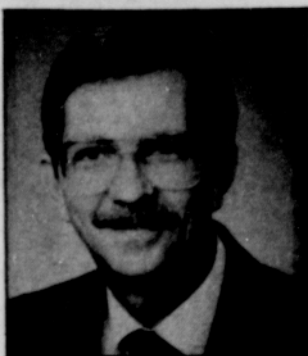
- A proposal to hire a civilian to manage equipment and vehicles. For the past several years, a deputy sheriff has been assigned full time to manage the fleet of about 100 patrol cars. The sheriff proposes to return the deputy to police duties and hire a civilian for those duties.

- Increased traffic in and out of the jail. That increase has created a need to add a corrections officer to the jail staff, Detloff said.

Except for the increases listed

above, the staffing and financing of operations are to remain essentially the same.

The levy would be broken into the following uses: patrol functions, 45.9 percent; investigations, 6.7 percent; administration, 6.6 percent; jail operations, 19.1 percent; data processing, 4.7 percent; civil functions (serving subpoenas, prisoner transports, courthouse guards), 7.3 percent; records, property control and support for sheriff's office, 9.6 percent.

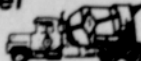
