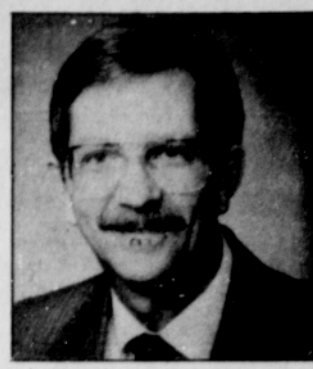
The burglary they are charged with occurred March 11 at T.J.'s Restaurant. A keg of beer was taken.
