Easter Egg Hunt set at Meinig Park

The Kiwanis Club of Sandy's annual Easter Egg Hunt will be Saturday, April 18, at 10 a.m. in Meinig Park.

The Kiwanis Club will give away 130 dozen colored eggs and 50 pounds of candy eggs. In addition, each child will receive a lily bulb donated by the Oregon Bulb Farm.

The hunt will be conducted in four stages. Youngsters up to the age of 2 will go first, followed by 3- to 5-year-olds, 6- and 7-year-olds, and 8- to 10-year-olds.

Youngsters must be accompanied by an adult.

Egg hunt planned at Boring School

A free egg hunt will be staged Saturday, April 18, on the Boring school grounds.

The egg hunt for children in preschool through fourth grade will begin at 10 a.m.

Nearly 800 eggs will be hidden for the youngsters.

The egg hunt will be sponsored by the Gresham Early Risers Kiwanis Club. The Boring grade school's Builders Club, an arm of the Kiwanis, will color the eggs and organize the hunt.

Local businesses have donated prizes.

Community service set at Meinig Park

The third annual Sandy Ministerial Association's Easter Sunrise Service will be held at 6 a.m. Sunday in Meinig Park. Most churches in Sandy belong to the association.

Four pastors perform the non-denominational service each year on a rotating basis, according to Fred Vogel, president of the Sandy Ministerial Association.

"People who don't attend a particular church might feel comfortable at this service," he said. About 150 attended last year.

Good Shepherd services set

day. The services will start in darkness at 6 a.m. and end in daylight, symbolic of Christ as the light of the world. The service is based on an ancient liturgy dating to the second century. A potluck breakfast will follow.

The church will also offer services at 7:30 and 11 a.m. Sunday. Retired St. Luke's Episcopal Church (G2esham) Rector Vic Gibson will celebrate the 7:30 a.m. service. The Rev. Tom Davidson, Good Shepherd's vicar, will be the celebrant at all other services.

Thursday, April 16 there will be a Maundy Thursday service at 7:30 p.m.

The church celebrates Good Friday with a noontime liturgy and Holy Communion. Confessions will be heard at 6 p.m. Holy Saturday, April 18, followed by a Solemn Vigil Mass in Spanish at 7 p.m.

Catherine Palladino

Catherine Marie Palladino, who played clarinet with the Oregon Symphony for over 30 years, died April 12 at the age of 56.

She was born Catherine Halverson on Aug. 1, 1931, in Bellingham, Wash. She came to Portland at an early age and soon excelled in school bands.

She was principal clarinetist in the Portland Junior Symphony and in the Lewis and Clark College orchestra. She became principal clarinetist of the Oregon Symphony at the age of 20.

She also played for other chamber music groups. She was chosen to represent the alumni of the Junior Symphony and gave a solo performance with that orchestra for the opening of the renovated Civic Auditorium in the late 1960s.

She taught music throughout her career.

Ill health forced her to leave the music world in January of 1984. She died Palm Sunday, April 12, at a Portland hospital.

She is survived by her husband, Robert; a son, Eric of Sandy; a daughter, Catherine Moore of Seattle; her mother and stepfather, Mr. and Mrs. Hilbert Haugen of Portland. Funeral Mass was held April 15 at

St. Michael's Catholic Church in Sandy. Private interment followed at Riverview Abbey in Portland.

Pauline Magee

Pauline Magee, a former resident of Bishop's Healthcare Center, died on March 31 at the age of 72.

She was born Oct. 30, 1914, in Parkersburg, Ore.

She attended school at Riverton, Ore., and lived most of her life in the Coquille Valley. She worked as a custodian and bus driver for the Coquille School District for many years, and had also operated Bullards Ferry for some time.
