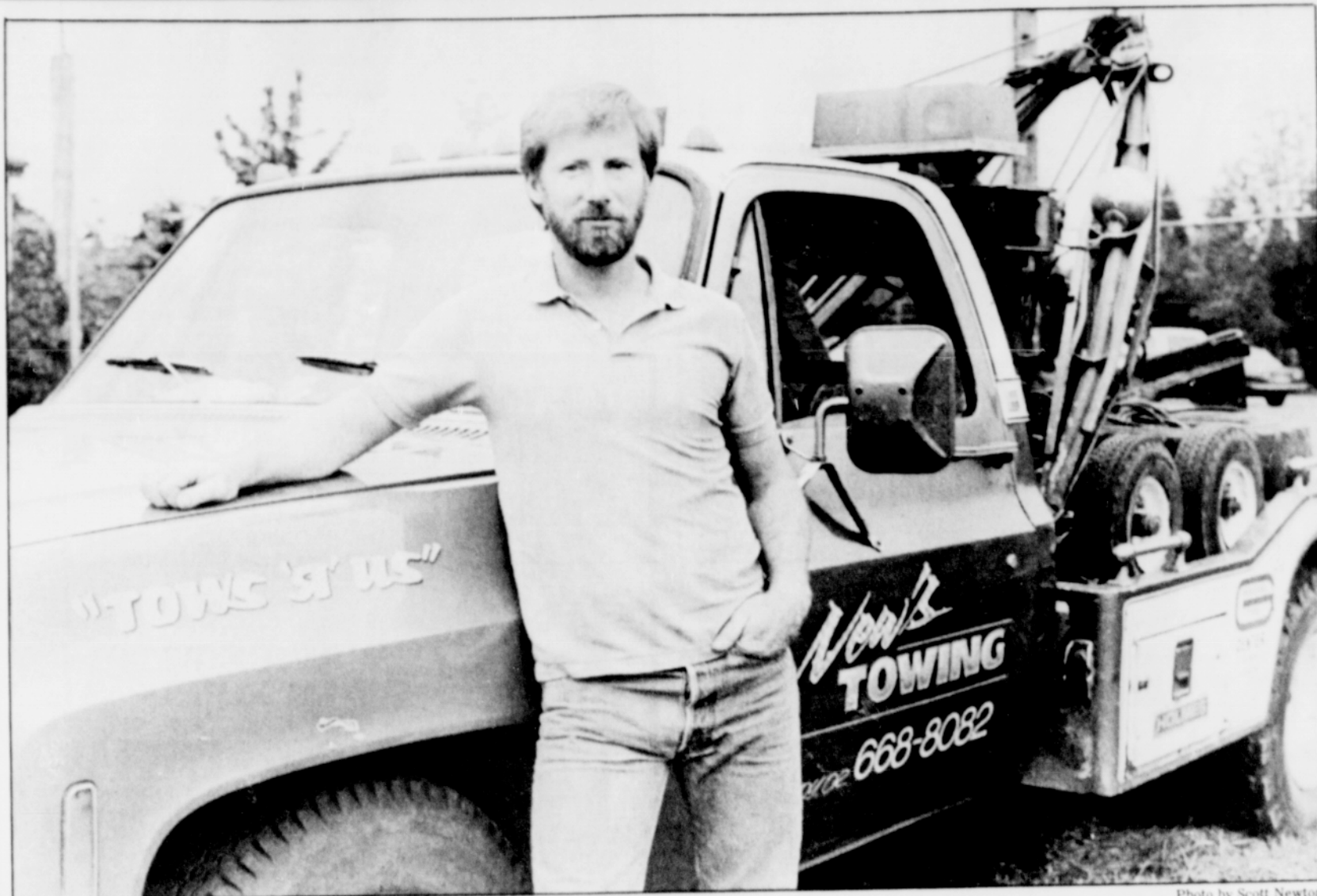




Gerry New of New's Towing will be hauling away abandon cars for free during spring clean up week.

## Spring cleaning set in Sandy

In the movies, it is always the sheriff who is going to clean up the town. In Sandy, it is the mayor who wants to clean things up.

Mayor Deane Wessellink probably wouldn't mind locking up all the bad guys in town, but in this case he is talking about the city's proclamation for the Sandy Spring Clean Up.

The City Council has spent a lot of time on its junk and weed ordinances. "We're trying to follow that theme with our clean up campaign," Wessellink said. "This is our way of showing we

are interested in helping out."

The city has coordinated a number of efforts by local businesses. Mount Hood Refuse will have a dumpster at Meinig Park on May 2 and 3, and at Sandy Grade School May 9 and 10. People may dump garbage and lawn clippings free of charge.

New's Towing of Sandy will haul off abandon vehicles free of charge. Gerry New, owner, said he gets paid for the car bodies but also incurs some expenses. The expenses outweigh what he

gets paid for the car bodies, but he said he does it as his way of contributing to the city beautification effort.

A local girl scout troop will pick up litter and trash in Meinig Park.

Wessellink said this will be the third year the city has sponsored a spring clean up. He said participation had improved in the second year, and that the city would probably continue to offer the services if the public will take advantage of it.

A legislative forum concerning Senate Bill 153 will be held at the Milwaukie Senior Center on Wednesday, May 6. Seniors interested in attending may register at the center. The van will depart at 12:30 p.m. and return approximately at 4 p.m.

Senate Bill 153 would require state funded pre-admission screening for all potential patients of skilled nursing and intermediate care facilities. Persons attending the forum will learn how the bill could inform seniors of all the alternatives when

nursing home placement is considered. Also discussed will be how Senate Bill 153 could affect length of hospital stays and health care costs.

The center will sponsor a Sack Lunch Social on Thursday, May 7, at noon. Bring your own lunch and socialize with others before enjoying a movie. The center will offer soup and coffee for 75 cents to supplement the meal. This month the movie "Witness" will be shown starring Harrison Ford and Kelly McGillis in a romantic thriller set in an Amish community in Pennsylvania.
