Last year the auction raised over \$3,000 and the organization needs to match or beat that figure again, said Murphy.

Flea market, quilt show set

A quilt show and flea market will be held at the Boring Grange Hall on Grange Street, off Highway 212 in Boring, on Saturday, May 9, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

There will be a 75-year-old carriage robe on display and a hand-embroidered linen sheet brought from Sweden in the early 1900s by the mother of one of the grange members.

The flax was grown, retted out, spun into linen thread and then woven into fabric. The loom was narrow and so there is a seam down the center of the sheet.

Also, there will be an old quilt backed with flour sacking with the faint imprint of the names of flour companies.

Cotton food sacks will be for sale, plus some burlap bags.

Old fashioned comforters made from men's suits and women's coats and dresses will be on display.

Lange said it is important that a parent or guardian attend the immunization clinic with the child.

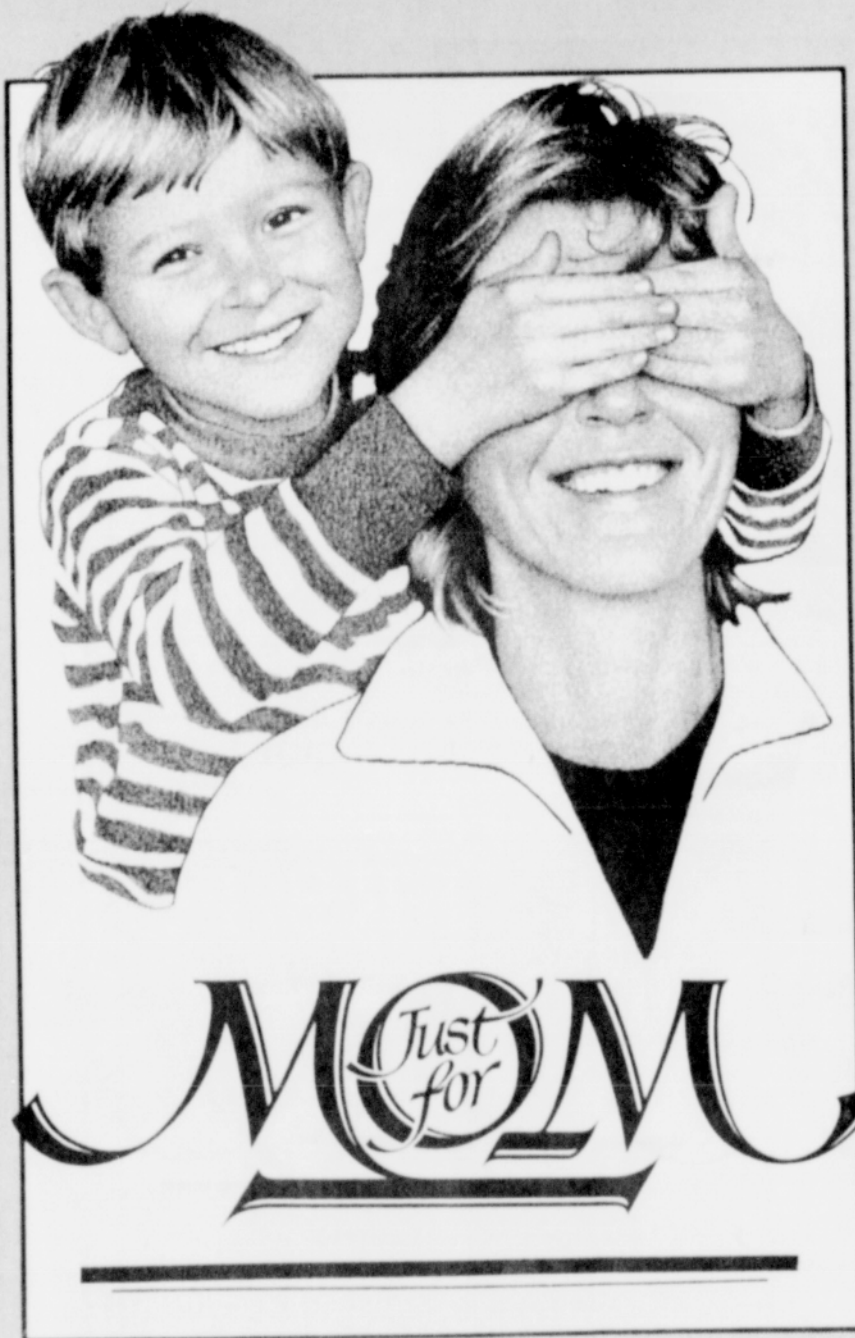
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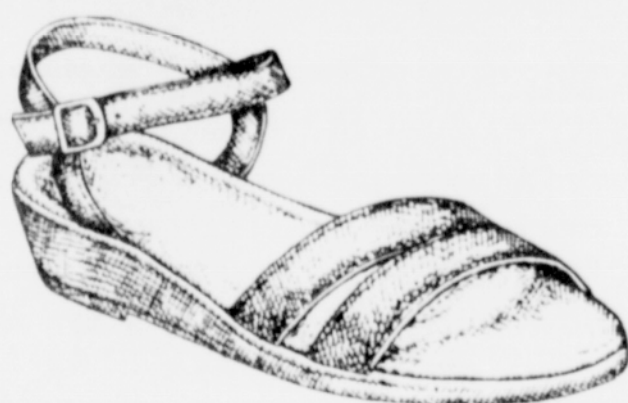
