

Win at Barlow ends slump for softball team

Sandy High School's softball team got a pleasant surprise Tuesday afternoon following a disappointing loss the day before to Centennial.

On Tuesday afternoon, the visiting Pioneers faced Barlow, a team which, going into the game, was only one game out of first place in the Mount Hood Conference. Sandy won, 6-5 in eight innings.

Sandy had to come from behind to do it, however.

Barlow exploded for four runs in the bottom of the first inning, taking a seemingly commanding 4-0 lead.

Later, after three innings, the Bruins held a 5-0 advantage over the Pioneers.

In the top of the fourth inning, however, Sandy made a run and chipped away Barlow's lead.

Liz Krenwinkel led off the fourth with a single. Jami Brittle then hit into a fielder's choice play, but both Brittle and Krenwinkel were called safe on a throwing error by Barlow's third baseman.

Kelli Portinga loaded the bases with a single. Sandy's Katie Clift then tripled, scoring Krenwinkel, Brittle and Portinga. Barlow was held scoreless in the bottom of the fourth but still maintained the lead, 5-3.

Later, with one out in the top of the seventh inning, Sarina Koons singled and later advanced to third on a

single hit by Monica Merrill. Krenwinkel then walked, loading the bases.

Brittle then ripped a single up the middle, scoring Koons and Merrill, tying the game 5-5.

Barlow threatened in the bottom of the seventh inning, but could not produce any go-ahead runs.

Then in extra innings, Portinga singled and later advanced to third on an error by Barlow's shortstop, with Clift safe at first.

Shannon Baker hit a sacrifice fly, scoring Portinga from third. Barlow went down in order in the bottom of the eighth, as Sandy won its first game in four outings, 6-5.

"It feels great," Sandy coach Gary Curtis said. "Especially after we stumbled so badly in the first inning."

"We didn't drop out heads and we came through."

Portinga went 3 for 4, including two singles, a double and two runs scored.

Defensively for Sandy, a recent addition to the varsity squad, sophomore Anna Knotts, played some "superb" defense in center field, Curtis said.

As for the team's offense, Curtis said his team is coming around.

"We had some long fly balls. We hit the ball long tonight," Curtis said. "But we also hit the ball where we wanted to, too."

The win upped Sandy's MHC record to 3-10 and 7-12 overall.

Against visiting Centennial Monday, the Pioneers had a 3-1 lead, but the Eagle came alive in the seventh inning, handing the Pioneers a 7-3 loss.

After Centennial scored one run in the third inning, Sandy scored twice in the fourth.

With one out in the fourth, Portinga singled up the middle and later stole second.

After Clift popped out to the Eagle first baseman, Koons doubled to center field, advancing Portinga to third.

Donna Gray then ripped an infield single, scoring Portinga as Koons remained on second.

Baker then made it to second on an error by Centennial's left fielder, as Koons scored. Gray was later tagged out at home plate, ending the inning as Sandy took a 2-1 lead.

Merrill scored in the bottom of the fifth inning on a center field single by Brittle. After five, the Pioneers had a 3-1 advantage.

Then in the top of the seventh, Centennial scored heavily. Two runs scored before Sandy could get its first out, tying the score.

Centennial's Julie Allais was credited with the game-winning run batted in on an infield error, scoring a teammate from third base. Following her single, the Eagles would go on to score three more runs and win, 7-3.

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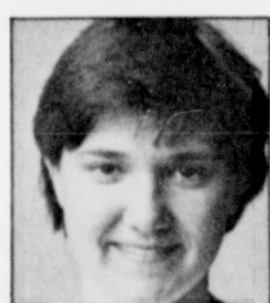

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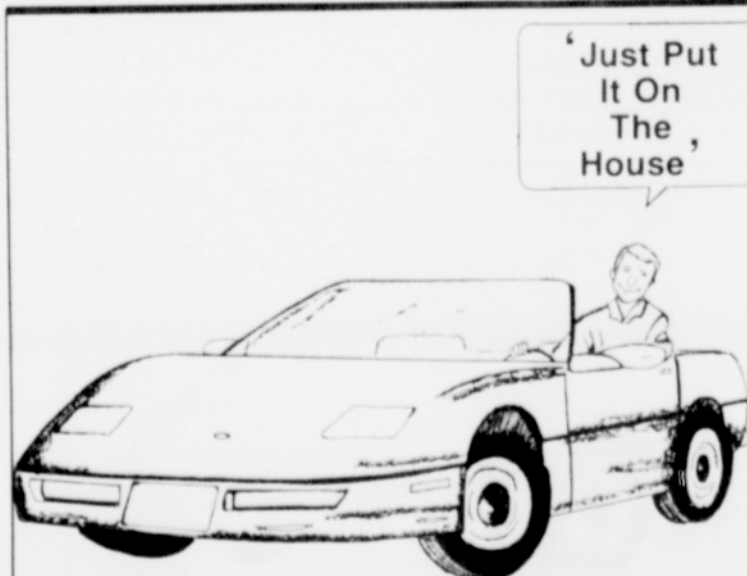
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
