Sharayah Hardman

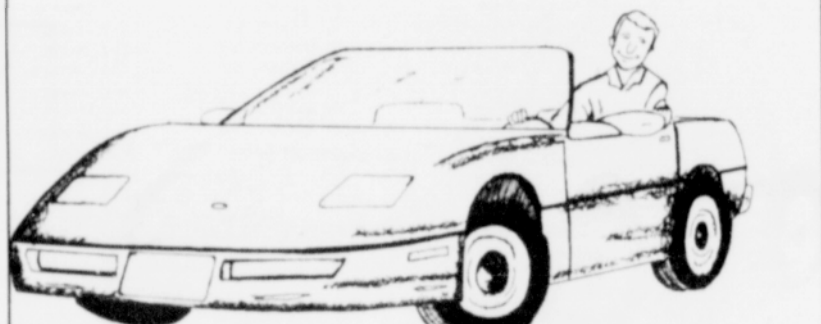

Grandparents are Reginald and Alice Burrell of Boring and Frederick and Carolyn Ashton of Oceanside, Calif.



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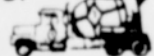
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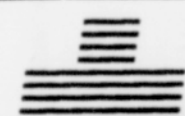
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
