

Girls end season with 4-9 MHC record

The Sandy girls tennis team ended its season with a 4-9 Mount Hood Conference record after a Friday afternoon loss at Barlow. They lost four matches to one.

First singles player Tami Tinjum was the only Pioneer to claim a victory, defeating Barlow's Kerrie Kraus in straight sets, 6-4, 6-2.

Meanwhile, the first doubles team of Haruko Inoue and Tracy Buss went to a third set with Bruins Teresa Carlson and Tami Russell. Inoue and Buss lost, 7-5, 0-6, 3-6.

The Pioneers ended the regular season with 25 individual wins compared to 40 losses.

Sandy defeated Centennial last Wednesday, playing in 96-degree weather.

Two of the matches were forfeited due to the extreme heat, with Sandy on the winning ends of the forfeitures.

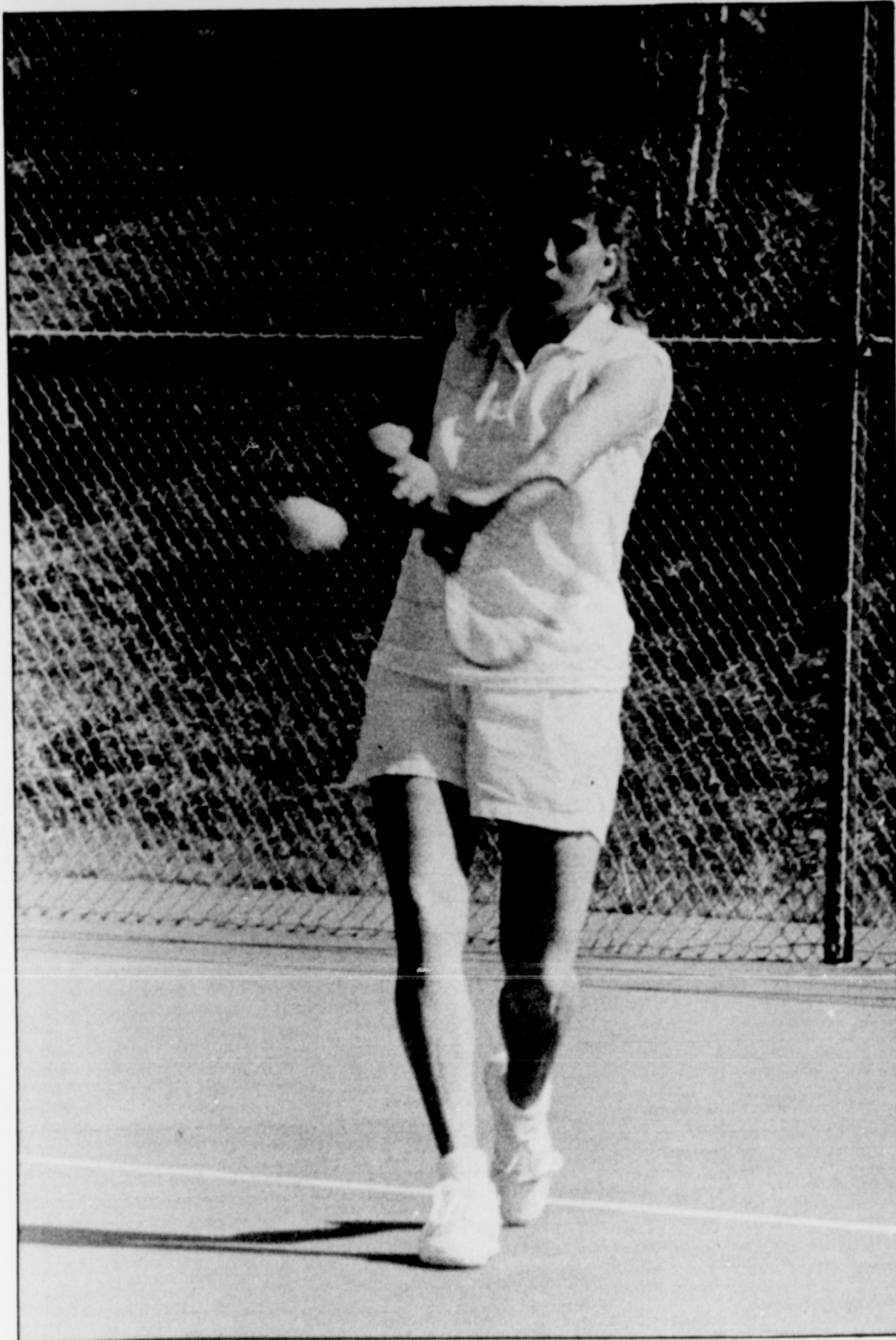
Second singles player Teri Buss won the first set of her match, 6-3, and was winning the second 3-1 before the Eagles forfeited the match.

The second doubles team of sophomores Jenny Sah and Susan Sutter won the first set of their match against Centennial's Laurie Raihala and Tami Martin, 6-4, before the match was forfeited.

Third doubles players Katie Tooley and Amy Brewster swept past Eagle freshmen Andrea Engle and Andrea Pennington in straight sets, 6-1, 6-0.

Inoue and Tracy Buss also defeated their Eagle opponents in straight sets, 6-0, 6-2.

The district playoffs begin Thursday and continue through Friday.

2 swimmers compete at international meet

Two members of the Blue Marlin Aquatic Club took part in a major swim meet in Walnut Creek, Calif., last month.

Nikki Hanson and Robyn Hayball competed in the Far Western swim meet on April 11-13. This meet included swimmers from the United States, Canada, England and Japan. There were approximately 1,150 swimmers entered in the meet.

Hanson, 11, competed in the 100-

and 200-meter individual medleys, the 50 and 100 butterfly, the 200 freestyle and the 100 backstroke.

Hayball swam the 100 and 200 breaststroke in the 15-16-year-old age group.

Hanson received personal best times in all but one of her six events. The 11-year-old placed 15th among 70 entries in the 50 butterfly and 13th among 55 entries in the 100 butterfly.

first half of the season," Curtis said.
