Seven individuals and three relay teams came away with first-place honors Saturday in the Sandy River Hawks track club's first home meet of the season.

Meanwhile, 16 athletes qualified for state competition in the meet held at Pop Rannow Stadium.

In the youth girls competition, Stephanie Clark took first in the javelin (75 feet, 3 1/2 inches) and second in the 100-meter dash. Stephanie Miljus took first in the discus (76-8) and the shot put (29-11).

Darnell Arthur of the midget boys took first place in the 80-meter hurdles (15.45 seconds) and in the long jump (8-10 1/2). In the midget 3,000, John Dixon won the event (12 minutes, 9.08 seconds). Lance Schamberger took first in the 800.

Also in the midget boys competition, the 400 relay team of Schamberger, Jake Simonis, Darnell Arthur and Ben Maddock took first (57.9). The 1,600 relay team of Schamberger, Simonis, Dixon and

Ryan Vollans also took first (4:58.3). For the bantam boys, the 400 relay team of Scott Schamberger, Aaron O'Meara, Reid Novotny and Keith Hutchenson took first (1:12.69). Hutchenson also took first in the 800 (2:52.24).

In the pre-bantam division, David Albers took first in the 800.

Teams from Eugene, Salem, Portland and Woodland, Wash., participated in the meet.
