

Sixth-graders will perform 'Mikado'

Sixth-graders at Kelso School will perform Gilbert and Sullivan's "The Mikado," a political satire, comedy and romance, on June 4 at 7:30 p.m. at the school.

The play mocks the British bureaucracy by making fun of an inept Japanese ruler.

It will be the third play produced at the school by Constance Kinder, a sixth-grade teacher. She is receiving help from Emanuel McGladrey, music instructor.

McGladrey, who has taught at a music and arts camp for the past six summers, said performing helps motivate students.

"When they have a vested interest, it makes a difference in how hard they're willing to work," he said.

Kinder said she has been producing plays because she believes they are a good way for students to top off their grade school experience.

The sixth-graders have formed two different casts of eight students each, and another 40 students perform in the chorus. The group has been working on the play, primarily after school, since February.

In addition to performing the play for the public Thursday night, the young actors will perform for students at Sandy Grade School, Firwood School and Kelso School.

Kinder said McGladrey has prepared a good, original musical score for accompaniment. In addition, the students will wear colorful Japanese costumes against a 14-by-30-foot mural of the Japanese countryside.

Kinder selected the play because

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days, the cost would be \$15,045.

The cost of building two classrooms at Sandy Grade School would be \$85,000, according to an architectural firm's estimate.

Furniture for five classrooms would cost \$19,875. Supplies would cost an extra \$1,965 and heating and custodial services for Sandy Ridge School would be \$2,970.

The district has 10 first-grade teachers and 210 first-grade students.

Since kindergarten students attend class half a day, Hunsaker said he thinks five teachers would be needed.

Hunsaker said it would be difficult to estimate how many children would attend kindergarten. Some parents send their children to private schools or educate them at home. Classes of children vary in size, although the lower grades seem to be increasing in size, he said.

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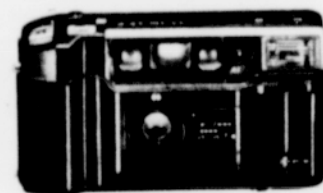


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
