

Palmer loses in first round

Sandy senior Chris Palmer said he was expecting too much last Thursday when he went into the OSAA-U.S. Bank state boys tennis tournament at the Tualatin Hills Tennis Center.

'It was a neat experience. It felt really good to make it to state. I had a lot of fun in my four years at Sandy.'

Palmer, who was a No. 4 seed a week previous at the Mount Hood Conference district playoffs, lost in the opening round of the state tournament to Dirk Alfke of Clackamas, 6-1, 6-4.

It was a matter of expecting too much from the competition and not enough from himself, Palmer said.

"Because I was a No. 4 seed at district, I went in there thinking I'd play one of the better people," Palmer said, adding that Alfke was not too tough an opponent, but that his own attitude going into the match was what contributed to the loss.

"I went in there with the wrong attitude," Palmer admitted. "I went in there expecting to lose. After I lost, I was watching some of

the people and they weren't really that much better."

The Sandy senior played well in his match, but Alfke picked up on Palmer's expectations and took advantage of them, Palmer said.

The first set took Palmer by surprise. He managed to tie the set at 1-1 before Alfke won the final five games.

In the second set, Palmer corrected his game and both players alternated winning games. Palmer then won two consecutive games, taking a 4-3 lead.

But Alfke used an effective combination of defense and serving to win the final three games and the match.

Palmer came close to tying the set at five games apiece when he battled Alfke to a deuce. But Alfke earned the deuce advantage and, after a long rally, Palmer hit into the net, awarding Alfke the victory.

"He hit some really good passing shots and discouraged me from approaching the net," Palmer said of Alfke.

Despite losing, Palmer was pleased that he was able to compete in the state tournament.

"It was a neat experience," Palmer said. "It felt really good to make it to state. I had a lot of fun in my four years at Sandy."

Palmer said his coach, Wes Williams, and his assistant coach, Greg Terauchi, were two of the main reasons he made it to state.

Gresham batsmen in semifinals

PENDLETON — The Gresham baseball team could be destined to win the Class AAA state title after winning its 15th consecutive game Monday in the quarterfinals of the state playoffs.

The Gophers erased an early 8-2 deficit against the Buckaroos and pulled out an 11-10 victory in nine innings to advance to the semifinals and end the season for Pendleton. The Gophers, 22-6, will host Metro-League champion Tigard, 25-4, at 4 p.m. today.

A win today over Tigard would send Gresham into the finals at 4:30 p.m. Saturday at Portland's Civic Stadium against the winner of today's Klamath Union vs. Bend game.

"I'm elated," said Gresham coach Jon Peterson. "We came up here and beat a traditionally tough opponent. This game really meant a lot to me."

Neither team mounted any serious attacks in the first extra inning. But Marc Scales led off the ninth inning with a home run over the right field fence to give Gresham a 11-10 lead. He also had a game-winning single in Gresham's 4-3 opening playoff win Friday over Putnam.

"I knew when I hit it, it was either going to hit the wall or go over and it went over," Scales said. "I love the pressure situations, it brings out the best in me."

Pendleton threatened to tie the game again in the ninth with runners on first and third and Rick Schimmel batting, but he grounded out to second base to end the game.

"The odds were really against us there," Peterson said. "He had reached base each time he was up and odds are that he was going to get there again, but we got him to ground out."

"We could be a team of destiny," said Peterson. "I don't know if that's what you would call it or if you would call us a team that really believes in itself and their abilities."
