

Retires after 26 years

Cook watched children grow

Nellie Lane, who has worked in the kitchen at Sandy Grade School for 26 years, said she has had the opportunity to watch a lot of children grow up.

"It's been fun working here," said Lane, who is retiring. "There is a nice group of ladies working in the kitchen, and the kids have been great. I've really enjoyed it."

Lane worked six hours a day as the head baker. Among the children's favorite baked goods, according to Lane, are cinnamon rolls, cookies and wiener wraps.

Louise Spence, food service director for the Sandy Elementary District, estimates Lane baked about 36,000 cinnamon rolls, 28,000 cookies and 18,000 wiener wraps last year.

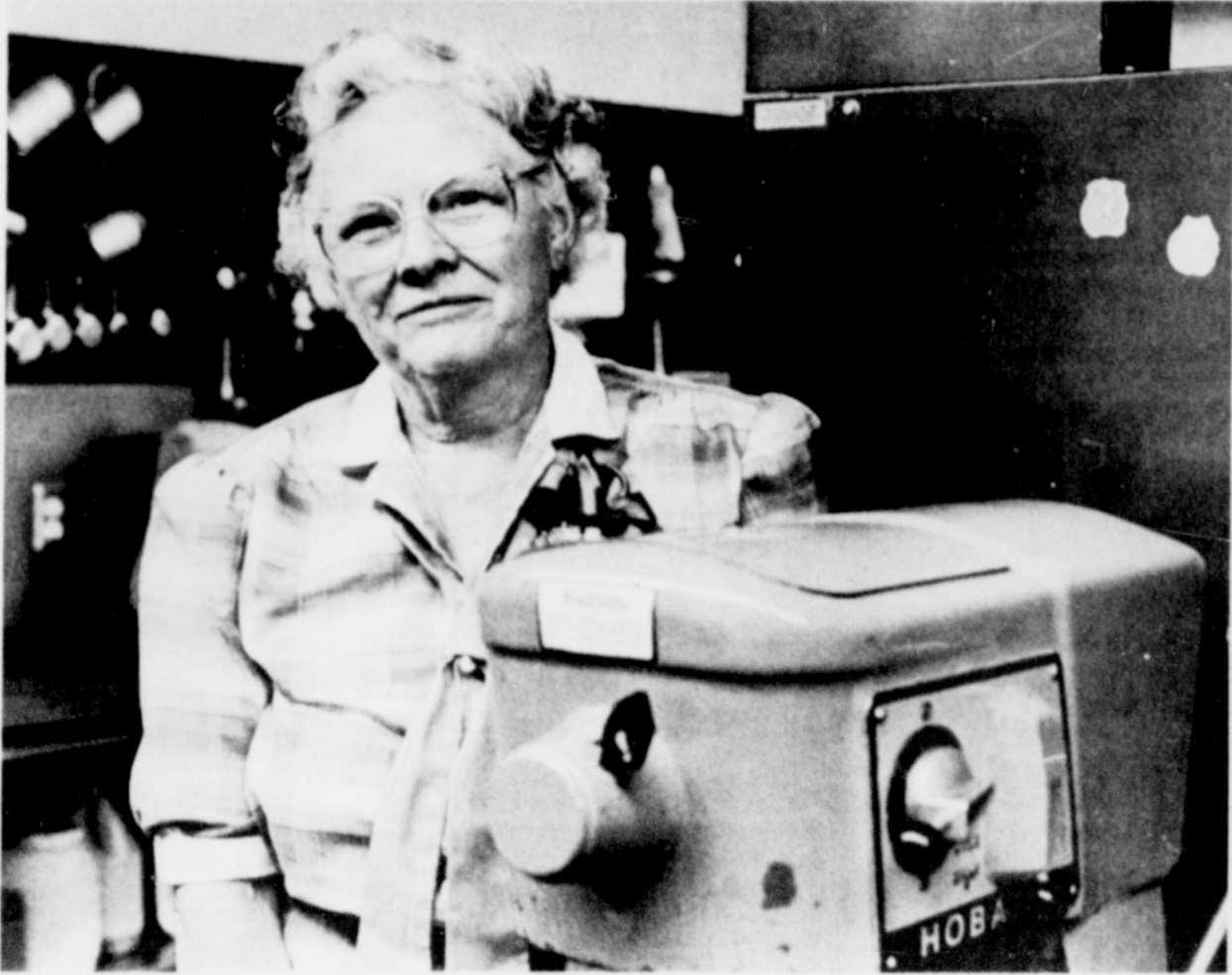
In the kitchen at Sandy Grade School, food is prepared for students at the grade school and Cedar Ridge Middle School. Some hot food — including most baked goods — are prepared there for Firwood School as well. Kelso School has its own, self-contained kitchen.

Lane, who usually works with an assistant, will often bake about 1,000 of whatever it is she is making. They serve about 750 meals but some children return for seconds.

"Everything we make is from scratch," Lane said. "That surprises a lot of people."

And, when she goes home, she doesn't mind cooking dinner. She especially enjoys making "fancy desserts," she said.

Lane and her husband, Charles, have three grown daughters, all of whom have graduated from Oregon State University and have worked as teachers. Two are currently raising families, and the other is working as a secretary. The Lanes

Charles Lane worked for 32 years in the district, having been a teacher, coach, principal and superintendent. He currently teaches jewelry-making at Mt. Hood Community College.

Lane said she doesn't have any plans for her retirement. She said she enjoys sewing, fishing, gardening and traveling.

"As much as we'll miss her, she has earned her retirement,"

Spence said. "This is hard work."

Spence said the 10-person food service crew gets along well, and that Lane's contribution and friendship will be missed. "It's like one of the family leaving home," Spence said.

Jerry Gillham, customer service representative for PGE.

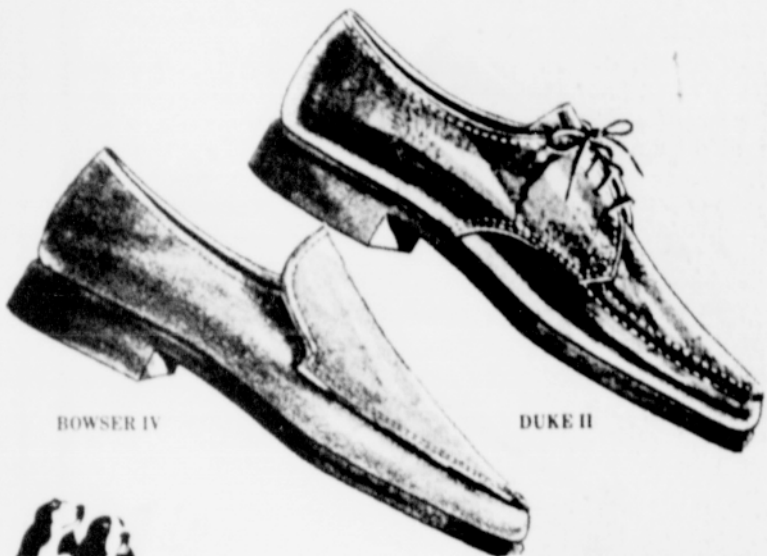
Also, as a part of its education program, PGE will teach local schoolchildren that PGE workers should be used as a resource in an emergency or to report suspicious behavior.

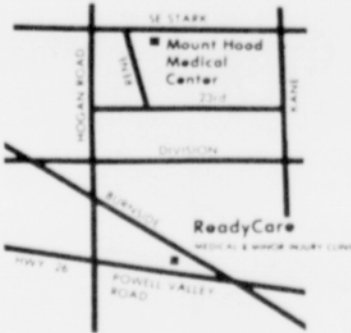
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EMISSIONS UPDATE

July 1, 1986, the date Oregon's Woodstove bill took effect, came and went and the world as we know it did not come to an end. It did change some. As Yoder Stove and Supply knows, the only new stoves that are legal to sell have been tested as being clean burning. Please be assured that we are still in business, at a larger location, with a large selection of DEQ approved stoves. They include some terrific new products. The law requires that new stoves emit no more than 15 grams per hour (18 grams in a catalytic stove). The law does not affect stoves sold before July 1st, nor does it affect used stoves. In 1986 the Oregon standard gets tougher, and federal EPA standards take effect. In 1990, tougher EPA standards will be implemented. Stoves will have to be about ten times cleaner burning than the best stoves sold in the 1970's. But remember: most stoves do not require a catalytic converter to be DEQ certified.

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
