Ethel Sutherland

Ethel Sutherland, a retired Sandy school teacher, died June 4 in Richland, Wash., at the age of 82.

She was born Ethel Marie Tibke in Douglas County, Neb., on Sept. 25, 1904. When she was 2, her family moved to Elgin, North Dakota, where they homesteaded.

After completing her grade school education and one year of high school, she went to Dickinson Normal School in 1919 where she finished her high school education and two years of college. While attending college, she met Clyde Sutherland and they were later married on Sept. 23, 1925.

After teaching in rural schools near Elgin, Ethel then continued her education at Dickinson State College. In 1926 they lived at Fryburg where she continued teaching. In 1929 they moved to Whitefish, Mont., where they lived for 14 years and raised their family.

From 1944 until 1952, the Sutherlands lived in South Dakota, and then came to Oregon to live at Jacksonville where Ethel studied for her teaching degree at Ashland. Both she and her husband taught at Jacksonville and in 1956 moved to Sandy to make their home.

Mrs. Sutherland taught the second grade at Sandy Elementary School until retiring in 1969. Besides being active with her career and family, Mrs. Sutherland was a member of the Sandy Community Presbyterian Church, the Retired Teachers Association, the Sandy Senior Center and the Golden Age Club.

She is survived by her husband, Clyde; two sons: Robert Sutherland of Sandy and Ted Sutherland of Caldwell, Idaho; her daughter, Sidney Howden of Richland, Wash.; a brother: Edwin Tibke of Elgin,

N.D.; a sister, Rosina Theilsen of Volga, S.D.; and nine grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

Services were held Tuesday, June 9, at the Sandy Community Presbyterian Church. Private mausoleum entombment will be at Forest Lawn Cemetery in Gresham.

The family suggests memorial contributions be made to the church or the Sandy Golden Age Club.

Allavene Cook

Allavene M. Cook, a former Sandy area resident, died of heart failure on May 24 while visiting her niece in Idaho. She was 75.

She was raised in the Sandy area, where she attended Corbett Grade School and Sandy Union High School. She married Fred Cook of Gresham in Vancouver, Wash., in 1930.

She was a member of Woodburn Christian Church and a member of the Woodburn Senior Center, where she enjoyed working with craft projects.

She is survived by her sister, Leona Griffin of Sandy.

Gladys Lane

A funeral for Gladys Mae Lane, who owned a 40-acre berry farm in Boring since 1936 and was a member of Gresham Senior Center's Hot Shot Band, was held June 6 at Bateman Funeral Chapel, 520 W. Powell Blvd. Mrs. Lane, who homesteaded in Nebraska before moving to Boring, died at her farm on June 2. She was 89.

She was born to Harry and Mary

Hillman on Jan. 16, 1898, in Hayescenter, Neb., where she was raised and lived until she married Louie R. Lane on June 3, 1917.

The couple moved to Sand Hills, Neb., where they homesteaded and raised cattle. They moved to Boring in 1936, and bought the 40-acre berry farm where she raised six children and lived until her death.

She was a member of Gresham Senior Center, where she played in the "Hot Shot Band," which performed and traveled throughout the United States. With the band, she performed at many county fairs, and at the World's Fair in Seattle.

She is survived by her children, Donald Lane and Robert Lane of Boring, Madean Horner of Gresham, Emma Dee Castle of Sandy, and Charlotte Woodcock of Huntington; her sisters, Irma Wilson of Gresham and Beulah Houseman of South Carolina; 30 grandchildren; 50 great-grandchildren; and four great-great-grandchildren.

She was buried in Forest Lawn Memorial Park. Her family suggests memorial contributions may be made to the Kidney Association of Oregon.

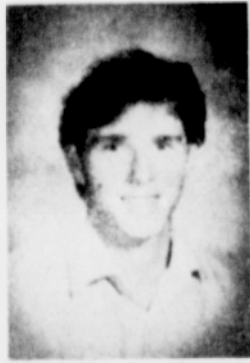

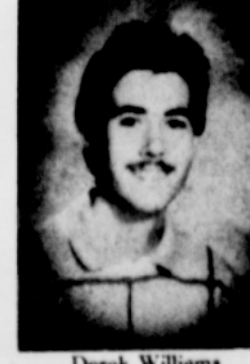

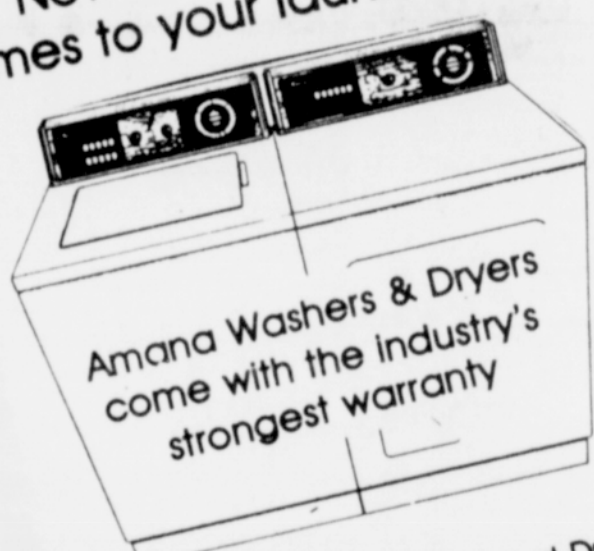
