

Contest nets 375 subscribers

A circulation drive netted the Sandy Post 375 new subscribers, according to Kevin Denny, circulation manager for the Sandy Post and Gresham Outlook.

"I appreciated all the kids' help," Denny said. "They did a good job." Eric Rolofson, his brother, David, and Jesse Lehman each sold over 40 subscriptions, leaving some doubt as to who would be the top salesman.

Eric Rolofson ended up the winner on Tuesday evening with 46 sales. He won a new BMX bicycle. Lehman was second with 45 subscriptions, winning a trip for four to the Inn of the Seventh Mountain in Central Oregon. David Rolofson sold 42 subscriptions and chose a scooter as his prize.

David Rolofson set the record for the most sales in one day with 13.

In all, The Post gave out \$1,500 in cash and prizes, which included six bicycles and a dozen skateboards. Denny said he also spent about \$200 at various pizza parlors in Sandy during the month-long contest.

The salesman may keep selling throughout the summer, earning \$3 for every new subscription.

The sales effort boosted The Post's paid circulation to 2,900, Denny said.

Denny worked at the McMinnville News-Register and the Salem Statesmen-Journal before joining the Outlook Publishing Co. two months ago.
