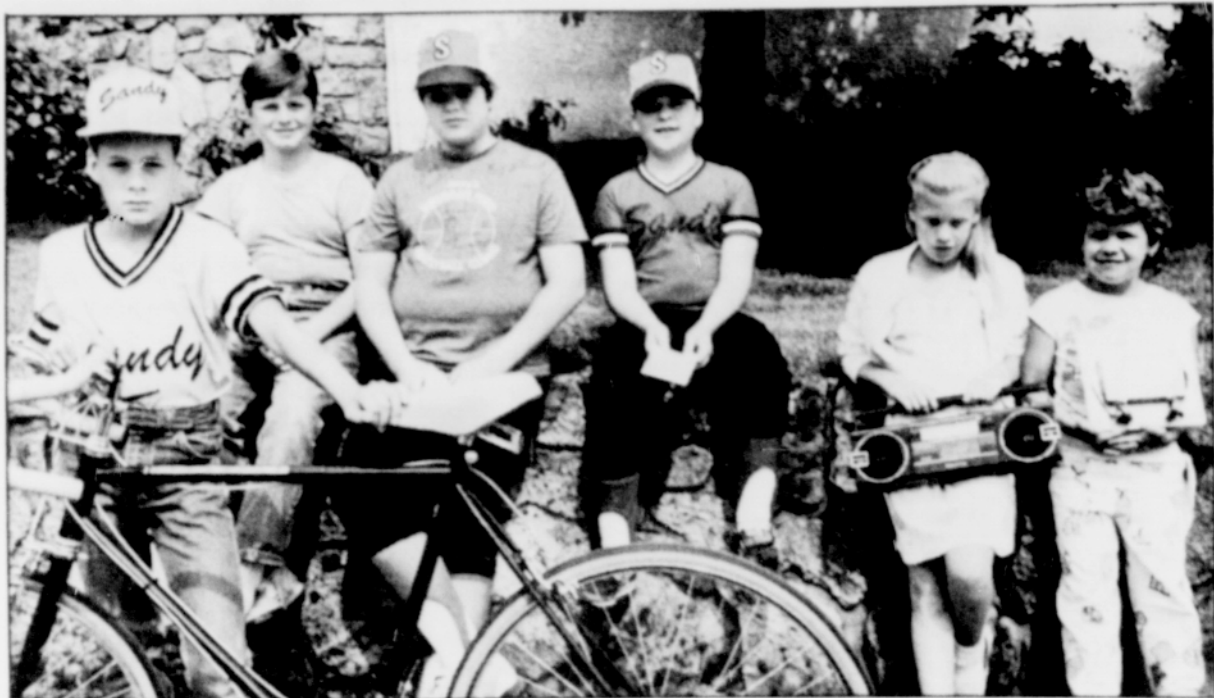




Top sellers

Reich named area delegate to international conference

Grace Reich will be one of 10 delegates representing the Oregon District of the International Lutheran Women's Missionary League when the organization meets in convention July 22 to 25 in Fort Worth, Texas.

Along with 632 other delegates from the United States and Canada, she will vote on matters that will determine the league's leadership and program for the next two years.

Among these matters is the selection of mission projects for the coming biennium. In the 1985-87 biennium, \$850,000 was gathered for mis-

sion projects in this country and abroad.

The convention will rally under the theme, "Radiant with God's Love." Speakers will use this theme as they address such subjects as mission service, education and inspiration. Ralph Bohlmann, president of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod — of which the Lutheran Women's Missionary League is a member — will be one of the speakers.

The convention body, expected to number over 8,000, also will hear Jean Garton, author on subjects such as abortion and women's roles in the

church. She is president of Lutherans for Life and in 1985 was named Churchwoman of the Year by Religious Heritage of America. Garton has twice been named as one of the 10 outstanding Lutherans in America.

Among the special events will be a gathering of quilts to be dispersed throughout the world through Lutheran World Relief.

Reich was chosen to represent the Mount Hood zone. She is a member of IMMANUEL Lutheran Church, where she is active in the local society of the LWML.
