Irvin Updegrave

Former Sandy resident Irvin R. Updegrave died of heart failure July 6 at his East Multnomah County home. He was 85.

The funeral was July 11 at Huston Funeral Home in Lebanon. Burial was at Oddfellows Cemetery in Lebanon.

Mr. Updegrave was born to Aaron and Susan Phillips Updegrave on March 25, 1902, in Sandy. He was raised and attended school in the Dover area of Sandy. He married Ella Jean Hanson of Sandy in 1924.
