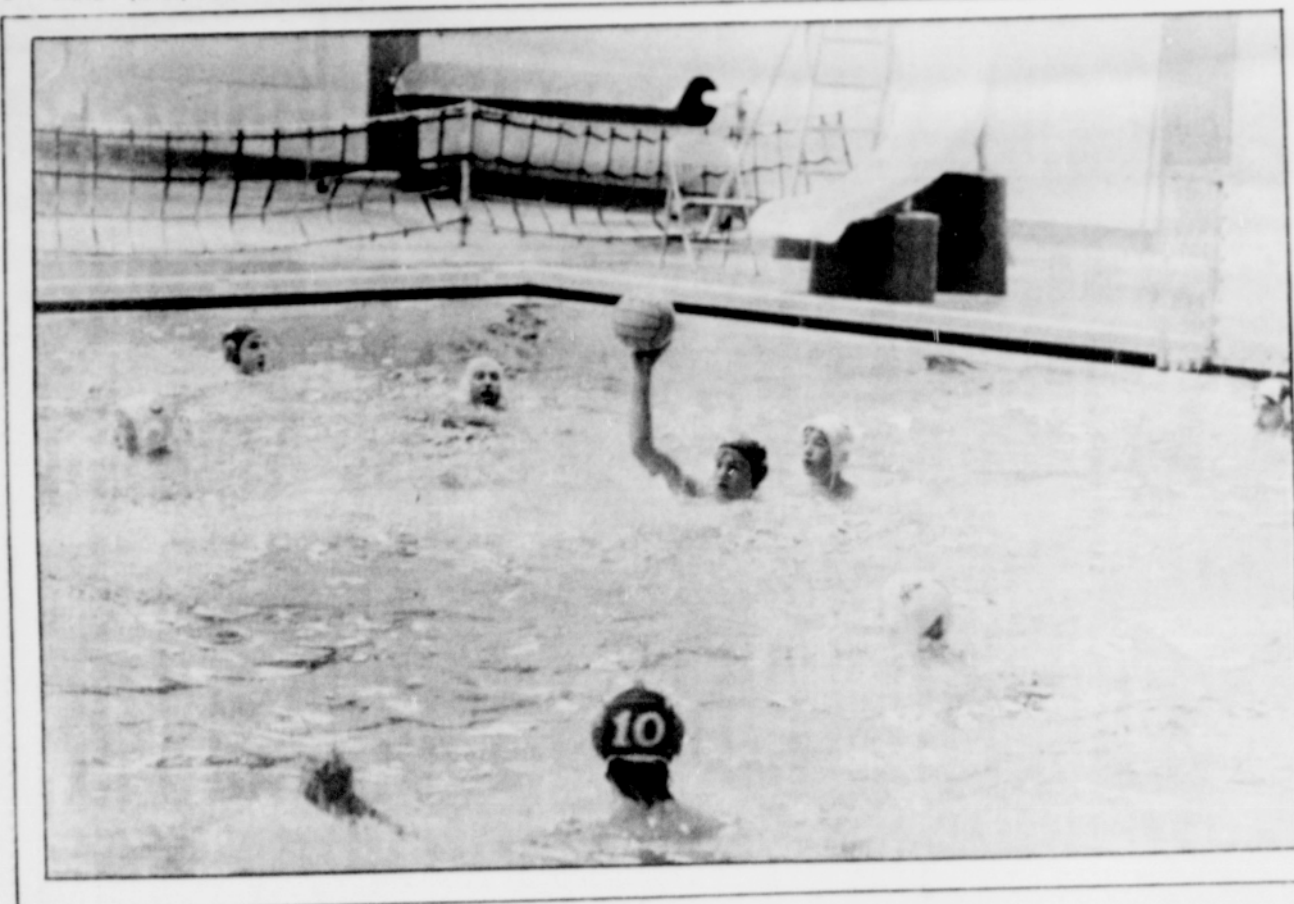




The Games have begun

Competitors in the State Games of Oregon's water polo tournament scramble for position in the deciding match Saturday at Sandy Aquatic Center. In women's competition, Chehalem (Newberg) Water Polo Club defeated Gresham WPC in consecutive best-of-three matches, 20-5 and 14-6, while in men's action, Gresham WPC defeated Tualatin Hills WPC 18-8 and 12-8.

Blue Marlin club claims four first-place finishes

The Blue Marlin Aquatic Club competed July 4 in the Lincoln City Swim Meet and had four first-place finishes, three coming from Derek Spires of the 13- and 14-year-old boys.

Spires won the 100-meter freestyle (1 minute, 3.63 seconds), 100 breaststroke (1:19.65) and the 100 butterfly (1:11.34) races in the Independence Day meet. It was Spires' first time racing in the butterfly event.

The other first place winner was Bob Richards in the senior boys 100 breaststroke. Richards finished that race with a time of 1:21.01, also a first-time swim.

In all, the 12 BMAC swimmers at

the meet competed in 47 events, 30 of which had personal best times.

There were four new "A" times and 12 new "B" times. Both "A" and "B" times are predetermined times, "A" being a tougher time to achieve than "B".

As a team, the Blue Marlins claimed second place overall, with 168 points.

There were seven second-place finishes. Mike Malchow (senior boys) and Stacey Stewart (11-12 girls) each claimed two second-place finishes, while Nikki Hanson (11-12 girls), Janine Williamson (13-14 girls) and Spires claimed one apiece.

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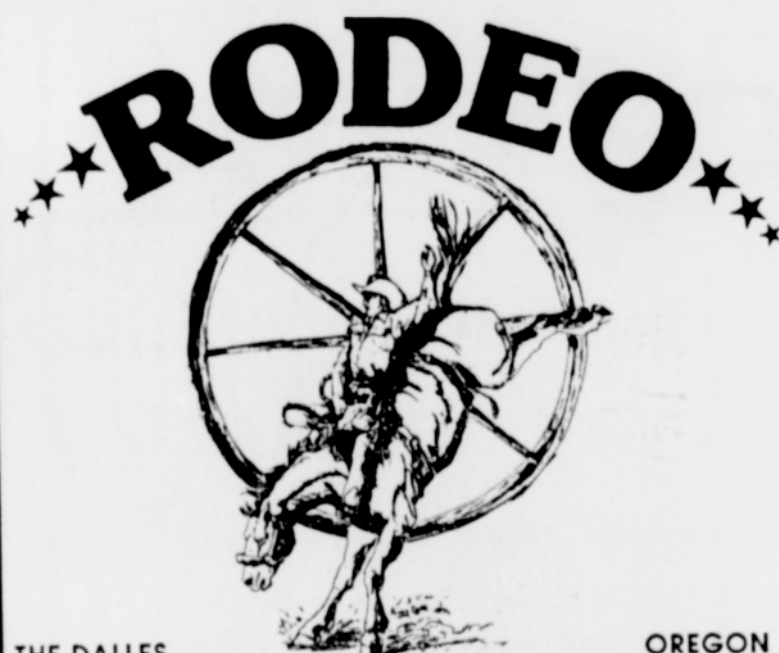
