Judge dismisses lawsuit against Corbett district

A lawsuit filed against the Corbett School District and Superintendent Dale Nees over the hiring of a janitorial firm and an architect has been dismissed.

But a lawyer for the plaintiffs said Tuesday, "It's not over yet."

The suit had claimed that the firm and architect were hired without bids being obtained.

James Laurick, a lawyer representing the school district and Nees, said after a series of motions, the lawsuit had been dismissed by pro tem judge Ward Greene.

"I am very glad to have this behind us," Corbett School District board chairwoman Catherine Dunlap said.

"I am concerned about the cost to the district of lawsuits that are frivolous. That's a real concern to me. You have to pay the deductible no matter."

The lawsuit was filed in

Multnomah County Circuit Court by attorney Henry Kane on behalf of Corbett residents Mona Phillips and Jim Mastne. Phillips and Mastne are members of the Corbett Taxpayers Association.

"I have no knowledge of it (the dismissal action) so I cannot make a comment," Mastne said.

Mastne said he had not conferred with the lawyer on the case since shortly after the lawsuit was filed in October 1985.

"Until I hear officially and see something official, I'd be stupid to make a remark or any comment on it," Mastne said.

Phillips was out of town on vacation and could not be reached for comment.

Kane could not say at this time whether an appeal would be filed in the Oregon Court of Appeals.
