

# Father, son square off in fair contest

## Men-only chocolate cake competition sets up battle within family

BORING — One day a year Art and Kevin Dean square off, spatula to spatula, eggs to eggs and chocolate frosting to top it all off.

Father and son, Art and Kevin will each enter the Clackamas County Fair and Rodeo chocolate cake baking contest for men-only this year in hopes of being chosen the king cake baker of the county.

The annual fair runs August 18 to 23, with plenty of activities and contests planned for each day.

The Deans have entered the cake contest for the last few years and they are hoping they will improve upon their past performances this year.

"I didn't do so well last year. Dad has improved each year," Kevin Dean said.

If their culinary talents don't impress the judges, however, they still will get a bellyful of some of the best cake in the county, Kevin Dean said.

"After the judging, we get to try each others' cake," he said.

Contestants may use any chocolate cake recipe, but it must be submitted with the cake. Cake mixes are not allowed.

The cakes are ranked by number and the winner will be chosen according to taste.

Another popular fair activity is the Cookie Jar Parade, scheduled from 10 a.m. to noon Aug. 20.

Contestants submit a filled cookie jar with a batch of homemade cookies and copies of the recipe. The cookie jars must be decorated and will be judged on originality and how well they reflect the fair's theme, "Where Memories Are Born."

Those who enjoy off-beat garden rarities may enjoy the Garden Oddities and Vegetable Art exhibits.

Both will be featured throughout the week in the agricultural crops division along with exhibits of vegetables, forage crops, shelled grains and seeds, fruits, berries, nuts and honey.

Vegetable Art is a special feature that will showcase sculptured or decorated vegetable products submitted by the gardeners with an artistic bent. Judging assistance will be provided by the Arts in Oregon Council.

Gardeners who look for the ultimate in size, shape or grotesqueness can enter the Garden Oddities exhibit. Prizes will be given for the largest watermelon, squash, pumpkins, cabbages, sunflowers and corn and the most freakish product of a county garden.

4-H exhibits are expected to be among the most popular features of the event again this year. The 4-H fashion review will be Aug. 20 and a ceremony recognizing outstanding individual achievement will be on Saturday.

People wanting to learn something as well as being entertained will have the opportunity to learn skills ranging from how to barbecue beef to the effective use of colors in creative art.

Demonstrations by experts in several fields will be presented each day of the fair, Mickelson said.

Topics will include the use of watercolors, oils and acrylics; sewing; food preservation; cooking salmon; machine embroidery; textile craftsmanship; uses of filberts in cooking; chicken dishes; and dough art.

A band called the Kaen Road Cowboys will perform country, country-rock and rock-n-roll of the '50s and '60s at 5 p.m. each day of

the fair.

In keeping with the fair's theme, "Where Memories are Born," television personalities who have entertained youngsters in past years will unite and portray the character he or she made popular.

Appearing on opening day at 7 p.m. will be Dave Alexander, who played Paul Bunion; Kay Lee of "Mother Goose"; Heck Harper, who starred in "Hector Flateau"; Rod Anders, of the show "Rambler Rod," which is still on the air; George Ross, television's "Doctor Zoom"; Charley La Franchise as "Uncle Charlie"; Dorothy Pierce, known as "Miss Dorothy"; Bob Atkins, of "Addie Bobkins"; Jim Allen, a clown; and Ed Leahy, television's "Mr. Moon."
