Activities set at Timberline Lodge

Timberline Lodge caps its year-long Golden Jubilee festivities with a four-day birthday bash, recreating many aspects of President Franklin Roosevelt's original dedication of the lodge 50 years ago.

Events will take place in both Portland and at the lodge. All are open to the public and many are free.

On Friday, Sept. 25, beginning at Pioneer Courthouse Square in Portland, there will be a recreation of the start of the original motorcade.

The winner of the FDR look-alike contest, Portland Mayor Bud Clark and other notables will kick off Timberline's golden anniversary. The ceremony will mark the opening of related exhibits sponsored by the Oregon Historical Society and the Oregon Art Institute.

Music from the '30s will be played by the Oregon Jazz Band.

• On Saturday, Sept. 26, at 3 p.m., there will be Indian dancing outdoors, which will be reminiscent of the original dedication.

At 4:15 p.m. on Saturday, the ceremonial motorcade with "FDR" will arrive, with many antique cars on display. There will not be an actual motorcade from Portland to Timberline Lodge.

At 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, there will be a rededication ceremony on the balcony of the lodge. Speeches by "FDR" and Governor Neil Goldschmidt are planned.

• The 50th birthday party will be held on Saturday, Sept. 26, from 5 p.m. to 1 a.m. Food will be prepared by Chef Leif Eric Benson. There will

be a fireworks display, and dancing to the Woody Hite Band. Tickets are \$55.

• On Saturday, Sept. 26, at 11:45 a.m. at Ullman Hall in the main lodge, Francis V. O'Connor of New York City will present a slide show and lecture on Works Progress Administration art to the Friends of Timberline. Tickets are \$7.

On Sunday, Sept. 27, at 12:30 p.m. at Ullman Hall in the main lodge, James Shenton, professor of history at Columbia University, will speak on "Timberline Conservation" at a joint luncheon of Timberline Lodge workers and volunteers. Tickets are \$7.

On Sept. 27, at 7 p.m. at Ullman Hall in the main lodge, O'Connor will

present a slide show and lecture titled, "The History of Murals in America" at the Friends of Timberline dinner. Tickets are \$17.

Reservations may be obtained in advance for the presentations by calling 226-7979. Tickets will be on sale at the information desk in the entrance lobby on Saturday, Sept. 26, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., and Sunday, Sept. 27, from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.

• A fly-over by antique airplanes will be from 2 to 3 p.m. Birthday cake will be served to guests, and chairlift rides will be given, weather permitting.

At 2:30 p.m., a plaque honoring Joel Palmer, for whom the Palmer chairlift and snowfield is named, will be dedicated.

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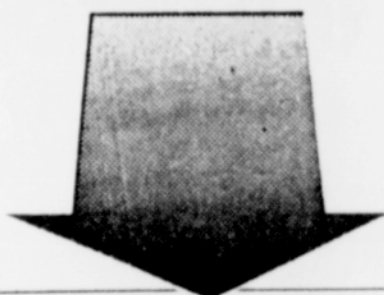


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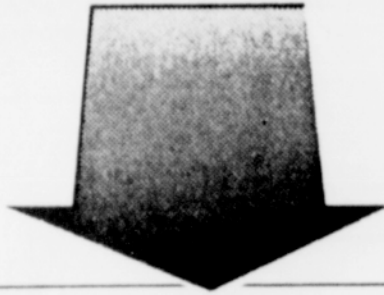
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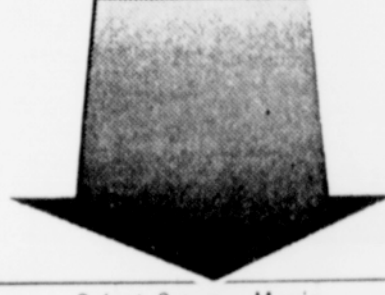

McGuire said, stating the position of the program, which he will adhere to.

In addition to being detrimental to one's health, possession of the substances by children is illegal.

In class, there will be two ground rules. First of all, no putdowns or "killer statements" will be allowed.

A killer statement, McGuire said, is worse than a putdown. Any student putting down another student will have to say three positive things about the student he or she has criticized.

In addition, there will be no "war stories" allowed. A war story might deal with the first time a student got drunk or be about an aunt who has three martinis before dinner.

McGuire, who has been with the district four years, taught a physical education class and an art class last year, but will not have that responsibility this year. He has also taught computer education.

This year he will be responsible for the drug education program in addition to his responsibilities as superintendent.

Although the drug education program will be more of a classroom commitment than he has had in the past, he thinks it is an area in which some good can be accomplished and he is anxious to do it.

"I get to teach" is the way I put it," he said.
