## Sandy girl first at state fair

It was seven years ago that Kristy Manley's father consented to letting her have a horse. Last month the 15-year-old Sandy girl proved she had learned about horses.

She was the grand champion in the senior horse judging contest at the Oregon State Fair.

Manley and 54 other finalists, the top competitors in local county fairs, took exhaustive oral and written examinations before Manley received the prestigious blue ribbon.

Manley might never have guess-

ed at the level of her accomplishment seven years ago. She dreamed of riding a beautiful horse, but her father, Mike, brought home a "big, fat Appaloosa," Manley said with a laugh.

Twyla, Kristy's mother, said, "She wasn't beautiful, but she was a good kids horse."

Later Manley began competing on "Just a Star Flame," called Star for short. The half quarterhorse, half thoroughbred gelding is more what Manley had in mind when she dreamed of owning a horse, although she never would have

guessed her horse would crave 7-Up.

Although Star will drink a can of 7-Up if it is poured into his mouth, he wouldn't drink a can of grape soda last week. Obviously, Star knows the difference.

Manley has won a number of awards in showing, judging and riding, but her 4-H career is coming to a close because she wants to participate in a student exchange program.

This current school year Manley will be taking a specially designed

program to allow her to graduate from Sandy High School a year early. Then she plans to spend a year in Spain.

Although traveling overseas sounds exciting, Manley will probably miss her horses. In her room there are tiles, dishes, a tablecloth and a chest of drawers, all featuring horses. She also has her ribbons and trophies on display alongside about 650 model horses.

"I've always been interested in horses," she said when asked about her room.

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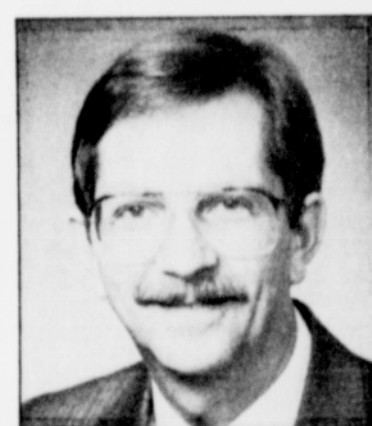
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
