Aumueller joins Houston Oilers

Roland Aumueller, formerly of Sandy, last week signed a contract as a replacement offensive tackle with the Houston Oilers of the National Football League, while talks continued between both sides of the NFL Players' Union strike.

After graduating from Sandy Union High School in 1981, Aumueller went on to star at Portland State University where he earned all-Western Football Conference first-team honors in both his junior and senior years.

The 6-foot-4, 292-pound Aumueller graduated from PSU last year.

Since the NFL players are on strike, replacement players were sought and hired so as to continue the season despite the strike.

Aumueller was practicing with the Oilers Monday and Tuesday and was unavailable for comment.

There were several other Oregon connections who signed with NFL clubs, trying for a spot on the replacement roster, but Aumueller was the only Sandy-area signee.

Open gym held at school

Deer season opens Saturday

Saturday is the beginning of Oregon's deer season, but hunters who wait until opening day to buy a deer tag will find them unavailable.

Friday, Oct. 2, is the last day to purchase tags. Once the season starts, tag sales will be halted.

Additionally, deer hunters wishing to use handguns must also have their tags validated prior to the Saturday opening date. The deer tag deadline is the same deadline for bear tags as well.

Tag sale cutoffs for elk season will also be the day prior to specific season openings. Elk tag deadlines are as follows: Cascade Elk, Oct. 16; Rocky Mountain Elk, first season, Oct. 27; Rocky Mountain Elk, second season, Nov. 6; Coast Elk, first season, Nov. 6; and Coast Elk, second season, Nov. 13.

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife urges that tags be purchased as soon as possible so as to avoid missing the chance to do so later due to shortages or long lines.

Shawna Kruger wins division

Sandy resident Shawna Kruger, 11,

Sunday competed in the Portland Marathon Five-Miler and was the No. 1 Oregon finisher in her age division with a time of 37 minutes, 29 seconds.

Kruger was second overall in the women's 14-and-younger category, behind Rachel Roscoe of Brush Prairie, Wash.

It was Kruger's second consecutive Portland Marathon Five-Miler, but her time was bettered over last year's fourth-place finish.

"She trained hard for it," said Kruger's mother, Ann. "Her time im-

proved greatly."

Five of the six members of the Kruger family competed in the Portland Marathon this year, the one who was left out being a son who is away attending college.

Shawna Kruger was a member of the Sandy River Hawks Track Club this past spring and summer. During the fall, she plays soccer and is not a member of the River Hawks cross country program.

She is a sixth-grader at Boring Grade School.

Girls get good win, rewrite history book

For the first time in Sandy Union High School cross country history, the girls team defeated Centennial. They got the win in a Mount Hood Conference meet last Wednesday at W.E. "Pop" Rannow Stadium by a score of 23-36.

The boys team, meanwhile, gave a gutty performance despite losing to the Eagles, 15-41.

It was the first MHC meet of the season for the teams. Third-year Pioneer coach Darold Beymer mentioned that in the two previous meetings against Centennial, Sandy's girls lost by a grand total of four points over both years.

Senior Kris Kruger led the team by taking second place overall, with Ruth Romey and Danielle Jordan in third and fourth places, respectively.

Rounding out the scoring five runners were Gayle More in sixth and Kim Yankauskas in eighth. Sandy's Shaune Summer and Michelle Clossner did not count in the final scoring, but they finished in the ninth and 10th positions, pushing the Eagles' fourth and fifth finishers back.

"Everyone is important on a cross country team," commented Beymer. "It was a good win for the girls." The girls team is now 4-0 on the season overall.

For the boys, Jeff Thomson led the effort, finishing the hill-filled 5,000-meter course in 18 minutes, 25 seconds.

Dustin Bithal and Jason Roberti each had strong runs, earning personal best times on the course.
