A number of business owners have been recognized by the Sandy Garden Club for their efforts in beautifying Sandy.

"These people have made a great effort to landscape their businesses," said Marge Jacoby, a member of the garden club. "We felt they deserved some recognition."

Well-maintained lawns and trimmed shrubs were not enough to garner top honors. The three award winners all had a variety of flowers blooming from May to October.

"Color is what they are pushing for," said Jacoby, who showed slides and counted votes at the garden club meeting last week.

The winning entry was the office of Ned Dyal, certified public accountant, and the Collector's Cottage, 38361 Proctor Blvd. The Sandy Fire District's station at 17140 Bruns Ave., was runner-up in the garden club voting.

Mount Hood Medical Services and Cascade Springs Dental Clinic were awarded third place honors. Sandy SENTRY, Charbos Restaurant and Tollgate Inn were presented certificates of appreciation. Other certificates appreciation were given the Flower Garden, Clackamas County

Bank, Otto's Cross Country Ski Rental, the Sandy Assembly of God Church, St. Michael's Catholic Church and the Sandy Seventh-day Adventist Church.

An awards ceremony for the winners will be held at the Wednesday, Nov. 4, meeting of the Sandy Garden Club. The meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. at the community center of Hood Chalet Mobile Home Estates, 17655 Bluff Road.

Ned and Shirley Dyal, who own the two first-place businesses, are both charter members of the garden club.

"She is the honorary and he's the ornery," said Jacoby.

The Dyals' landscaping scheme features a split-rail fence and antique farm implements, surrounded by ivy and blue lobelia, yellow marigolds, red petunias and red geraniums. There are also azaleas and rhododendrons that bloom in season.

The antiques in the landscape are subject to change because the Dyals sometimes sell them right out of the front lawn.

Shirley Dyal said she and her husband spend considerable time preparing the landscaped area in the spring. Friends and neighbors seem to appreciate the effort.

"We receive a lot of nice comments," she said.

Ron Berglund, a volunteer firefighter, does a good deal of the work at the fire station.

"The color combination is super," said Jacoby of the red petunias, yellow marigolds and blue lobelia that decorate the front of the fire station.

At Mount Hood Medical Services and Cascade Springs Dental Clinic, 38872 Proctor Blvd., Lisa Springate maintains what Jacoby calls a "depression-era" flower garden. The mixed bag of flowers — zinnias, hollyhocks, snapdragons and nasturtiums — are reseeded every year, saving the gardener the expense of purchasing flowers, Jacoby said.

Springate's garden is located on the Strauss Avenue side of the two business. Springate is office manager for Cascade Springs.

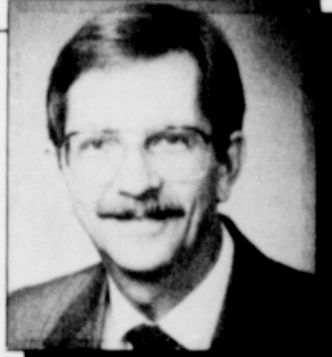
