

Dealer donates pickup to high school

Carlson Chevrolet and the Portland branch of the Chevrolet Motor Division have donated a 1987 Custom Deluxe pickup to the Sandy High School industrial mechanics program.

Mark Lally, instructor, said many students work on their own cars during industrial mechanics classes. The students' cars, he said, do not even have electronic ignition.

By working on a new vehicle, students will be able to keep up on the latest in automotive technology, Lally said.

The new Series 10 pickup was damaged in shipping and therefore could not be sold, according to Jerry Buskirk, parts and service manager.

Buskirk said General Motors will not allow any car to be sold if there is the possibility it has received frame damage in shipping.

The school district is not allowed to use the vehicle for any purposes other than instruction, but Lally said that would be helpful.

New vehicles all work on a computer control system, Lally said. "The computer is doing the tune-up as you drive down the road," he said. "You don't just give a car a tune-up anymore."

Lally said students still need a basic understanding of mechanics, but they also need to understand the new electrical systems that control the air-fuel mixture, the timing and other functions.

Lally said the high school doesn't have all the equipment it needs to work on new vehicles, but he plans to include some of it in the budget he will propose next year. In the meantime, he said a member of the industrial technology advisory committee will set up, and demonstrate, how to run computer checks on the

new pickup.

Superintendent Kent Heaton said, "We feel the kids will profit immensely. This should help create an interest in the industrial mechanics program."

"It's a civic-minded Chevrolet dealer who is helping us make this great technological jump."

Carlson, who is in his 20th year of business in Sandy, said he was glad to make the donation to his "favorite" high school.

"I'm grateful to the Chevrolet

Motor Division for their generosity in giving this new truck to Sandy High School," Carlson said. "When they do something like this, it makes me proud to be a Chevrolet dealer."

Buskirk said Carlson Chevrolet would back up its donation with technical manuals, and that their mechanics would be available to answer questions for students.

Lally, who is in his first year at the high school, said he was anxious to establish a working relationship with

Carlson Chevrolet. He said Buskirk had offered to loan him videotapes and other training materials from General Motors's circulating library.

According to a press release from the Chevrolet Motor Division, the company has donated about 6,000 vehicles to schools across the U.S. since 1972.

This is the second vehicle that has been donated to Sandy High School. Carlson Chevrolet and the Chevrolet Motor Division donated a van to the high school four years ago.

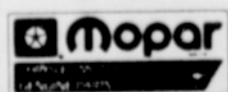
