Smith took over the Sandy program in 1980-81 and it has not only seen more victories, it has also become a dominant program in Oregon athletics.

While attending Western Oregon State College, Smith played football under two coaches who were instrumental in helping establish Smith's coaching philosophy. He said Dr. Bill McArthur and Greg McMackin taught Smith that sports are important.

"As I look back on my many activities in athletics, the coaches I liked best, personally, were the ones who could motivate," Smith said, crediting McArthur and McMackin. "Both those people helped me put the game in the proper perspective: It's just a game, and winning and losing wasn't as important as your efforts."

Some of the efforts that Smith liked, regardless of what the

scoreboard reflected, were players diving on the floor for loose balls, hustling to beat the press and working toward trapping the ball on defense: "The little things that are easy to teach but take a little extra desire to execute."

Although he is no longer coach, Smith will continue to be a part of the Sandy girls basketball program.

"I see my role this year as a supervisor of officials. They're not going to be able to tell me to sit down," Smith said. "I'm just kidding, of course."

"It's interesting. I don't really know how I'm going to handle the games. I will obviously keep my perspective on the game in that fact that I'm just a fan now," he said.

A fan now, but in all probability a coach again later.

"I would suspect that I will be coaching girls basketball in the next five years," Smith said.

tributed a lot to my success as a coach, just based on his knowledge."

Since she has inherited the job from Smith, who was the Pioneers coach for eight seasons, she has gotten to know his philosophy and would like to carry that over to however many girls come through the program in her tenure.

"I'd just like to be able to maintain the level of achievements that John brought to the program," Knudsen said. "He took the program from practically nothing and worked hard to develop basketball to where it is now."

The Smith/Knudsen coaching team brought Sandy to the state championship tournament twice. Knudsen would like to

make it there as a head coach.

"Ultimately, the goal of every coach, I would think, would be to be in the state tournament on a consistent basis."

Knudsen attended Centennial High School in Gresham before graduating from Oregon State University in Corvallis. Prior to coaching basketball, she was the Pioneers gymnastics coach, when there was such a team.

When her teams finish their respective seasons, Knudsen said she would like to see them apply to life what they learned on the basketball floor.

"One of the things I would really like the kids to learn is commitment," she said. "It's real important to be committed to something and sticking with it."
