Mailing season is under way

The Christmas mailing season is once again upon us. Sandy Postmaster Arnie Becker asks that mailers be certain mail is addressed properly and includes Zip codes.

For sealing packages, pressure sensitive filament tape or reinforced Kraft paper tape is recommended.

Cellophane and masking tape is not acceptable and string and twine should not be used as it may become entangled in sorting equipment.

The neighborhood Post Office located at Star Video at the Sandy Marketplace is now open. The hours are from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., Mondays through Saturdays. These expanded hours will help accommodate the mailers who have difficulty getting to the main Post Office during regular

hours, Becker said.

According to Bill Cornell, postmaster at Boring, the community Post Office, located at the Damascus Thriftway Store, also has expanded hours. It is open from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Mondays through Saturdays, and from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Sundays.

Most postal services, except parcels for foreign destinations, are available at both community Post Offices.

"Last year our customers helped us tremendously by mailing early in the season and early in the day," Becker said. "We hope they will cooperate with us again this year so we can enjoy another successful mailing season."

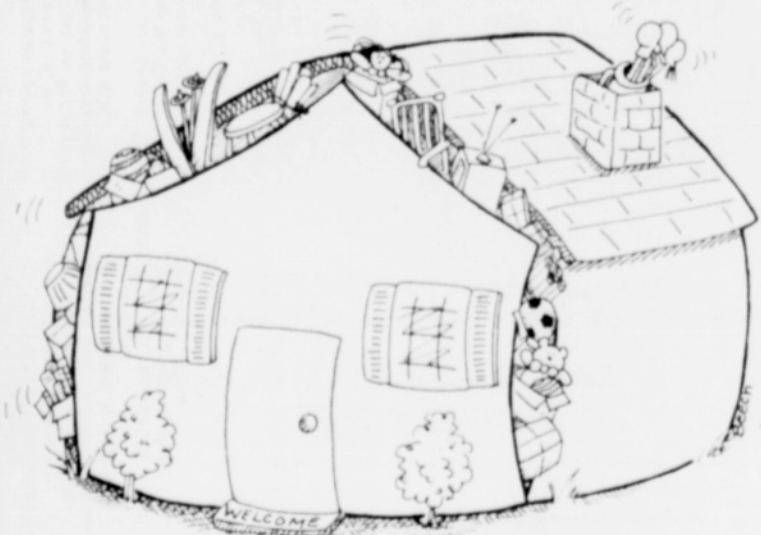
