

Restaurant rolls calender back to '75

The owners of T.J.'s Restaurant in Sandy will roll the calender back to 1975 on Saturday when they celebrate the 13th anniversary of their business.

Bill and Bette Herzog, who purchased T.J.'s in December 1974, say they will serve food at the original prices.

The road from 1974 to 1988 has been paved with long hours for Bill. The Herzogs opened a lounge next to the restaurant in December 1977, which means that workdays can start in the restaurant at 6 a.m. and end at the lounge between midnight and 2:30 a.m.

The restaurant, located at 39024 Proctor Blvd., stays open every day but Christmas. Bette said on weekends Bill will often stop at the restaurant to work a few hours and end up working a full day.

"No matter when you come in, employees have questions," Bill said. "I think it makes employees more comfortable when the owner is around."

Bill said studies show that good service is the most important ingredient for success in the restaurant business. For that reason, he is pleased to have an "excellent waitress staff." All in all, Bill said they have

as good a crew as they have ever had.

Good food and competitive prices are the other essentials that keep customers coming back, he said.

Bill said 80 percent to 90 percent of their business comes from repeat

customers. With better signage, they might be able to pull in more

travelers off Highway 26, Bette said.

"The people of Sandy have been good to us," Bill said. "We've had our ups and downs like everyone else."

"Our 1975 prices are a way of showing appreciation to the people who have supported us," Bette said.

On Saturday, menu items will be on sale at the prices offered 13 years ago. Restaurant manager Chris MacDonald used one of the original menus to set up the special.

Eggs, hash browns, link sausages and toast will be sold for \$2.25. A comparable breakfast today would cost \$3.95.

A chicken fried steak will be sold for \$3.75 on Saturday. The 1988 price is \$6.25.

Bill said there were four restaurants in Sandy when they purchased the business. Now the area has 24 restaurants.

The Herzogs also have observed a number of changes downtown. Heritage Square had not been built when they purchased the restaurant. They have watched neighbors such as Decker and Scale's, Grockett's Jewelry and Stones close up shop.

With approximately 18 to 20 people employed full time, T.J.'s remains one of the anchors downtown.

The hours are 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. weekdays, and 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. on weekends. The lounge is open from 11 a.m. to midnight during the week, and from 11 a.m. to 2:30 a.m. on weekends.
