## Revised sign ordinance presented to City Council

The Sandy City Council plans to hold a workshop on proposed changes to a sign ordinance now that a committee studying the issue has completed its work.

Joe Langella, the owner of a downtown restaurant, and other business people are proposing changes to the city's sign ordinance. Langella has met with about five other business people, with help from several others, on proposed changes to the code.

Councilor Jim Duff said the council would hold a workshop on the proposed changes, with business owners invited to participate. A public hearing would be held before any changes

were made to the ordinance, Duff said.

Langella said the proposed changes would make the sign ordinance less restrictive for business owners.

Highlights of the proposal include increasing the allowable signage from 50 square feet to 200 square feet for all businesses; allowing free-standing signs for all businesses; raising the allowable height of signs from 35 feet to 50 feet; allowing pennants, banners and streamers year-round; and giving the city staff the functions of the Design Review Board, thereby eliminating the DRB.

### Sentencing set in hit-and-run

Ralph Simich, 49, of Milwaukie, is scheduled to be sentenced Jan. 29 in connection with a hit-and-run accident that caused serious injury to a former Sandy High School athlete.

A jury convicted Simich in December of felony hit-and-run, third-degree assault and driving with a revoked license. Sentencing was scheduled for Jan. 19 but has been rescheduled for Friday, Jan. 29, at 9 a.m. in the Clackamas County Courthouse, 821 Main Street, Oregon City.

Richard Meyer, known for his participation in triathlons and other athletic activities, was paralyzed from the waist down in the February 1987 accident.

Nancy Boyles, Meyer's sister, wrote a letter to The Post last week asking people to attend the sentencing as a show of support.

S. Dennis Miller, senior deputy district attorney, said Simich will remain in custody of the Clackamas County jail until the sentencing.

Bidders must meet the following qualifications: they must have been in the business of fabricating or rebuilding truck bodies for at least ten years, the last five in the same location, they must have fabricated not less than ten fire engines, or rebuilt, refurbished, or re-manufactured not less than twenty fire engines each year for the last three years, and each bidder must furnish five references relating to building or rebuilding fire engines.

All bids must be accompanied by a surety deposit in the form of a bid bond, a certified or cashier's check made out to the Hoodland Fire District No. 74 for ten percent (10%) of the bid.
