

Woman gets luck of draw

It wasn't a high-dollar lottery ticket, but Lillis Hammers did pretty well at the Mountain Festival. She won a quilt that was appraised at \$300.

The brightly colored quilt features fine needle work in the decorative material that is the shape of flowers. The top of the quilt was given by an anonymous donor.

Lena Barber of Gresham and Susie Stapleton of Sandy put the backing on and finished putting the quilt together.

Hammers and her husband, who moved to Sandy four years ago, took a friend to the festival Sunday, and while they were there they viewed the quilt.

Hammers bought three \$1 tickets, and one was drawn July 14.

The raffle was a fund-raiser for the Loaves and Fishes nutrition program, and local senior citizens raised \$381.

They had sold 247 tickets by the time the Mountain Festival was over, and then Ernie Heggie went out and sold another 175 tickets, said Gretchen Chilton.

Other tickets were sold at the Sandy Senior Center before the drawing.

"I was thrilled to get this," Hammers said. "It's really pretty."

As a girl, Hammers had worked for eight years making the top of a quilt, but lost it during a family move.

Chilton said an appraiser estimated the quilt was more than 50 years old and worth approximately \$300.

Timing important to filbert worm control

Well-timed filbert moth control helps keep home-grown filbert free of filbert worm infestations.

"Filbert worms are best controlled by controlling the filbert moths that produce the worms," said Ray McNeilan, Oregon State University Extension Service home gardening agent.

Adult filbert moths have gray to reddish, golden bands across each forewing. They begin emerging about the beginning of July. Soon after they emerge, the female moths begin laying eggs on filbert tree leaves and the eggs begin hatching into larvae after a period of eight to 10 days.

After hatching, the larvae move to the underside of filbert leaves where they begin feeding. The young larvae are quite active until they find a filbert nut to enter.

The worm enters between the nut shell and the husk. When it reaches a tight space it begins boring into the soft tissue of the husk. Eventually the

worm bores into the nut itself, ruining it.

Diazinon and carbaryl chemical sprays are recommended for control of filbert moths.

"If you desire not to use chemical controls for this pest, some damage to filberts on infested trees will likely occur," McNeilan said.
